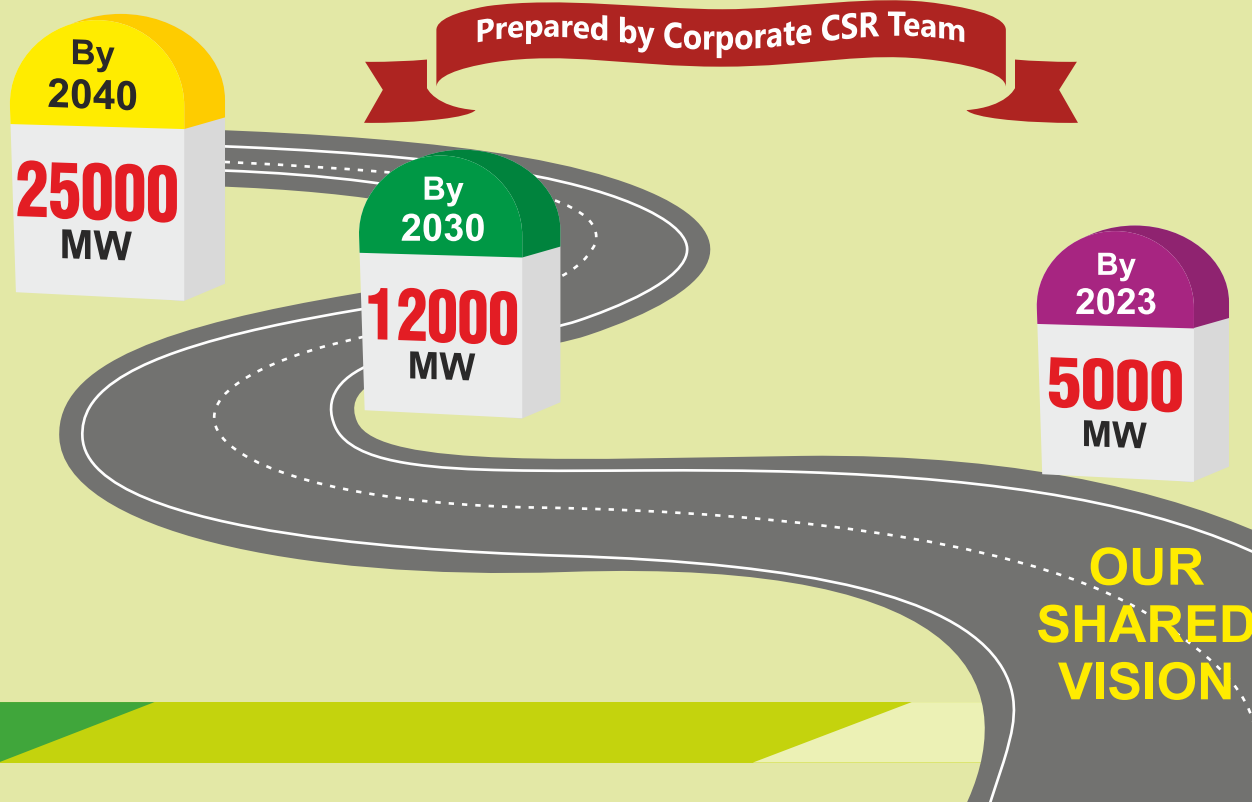

SJVN has assimilated Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) as an integral part of its business and is pledged to fulfil its social and environmental commitments for meaningful organisational growth.

SJVN has formulated and adopted a well-designed CSR and Sustainability Policy initially framed as per CSR Guidelines issued by DPE and further revised time to time as per government statute. Presently the CSR and Sustainability Policy has been revised as per the provisions laid under the Companies Act, 2013 and the CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Rules notified by MCA in the pursuit of the aforesaid Act. Based on the provision kept under the aforesaid Act, the Annual CSR and Sustainability Budget Plan is kept equal to 2% of the average of last three years net profit of the company and the plan is recommended by board level committee of directors on CSR and approved by the Board.

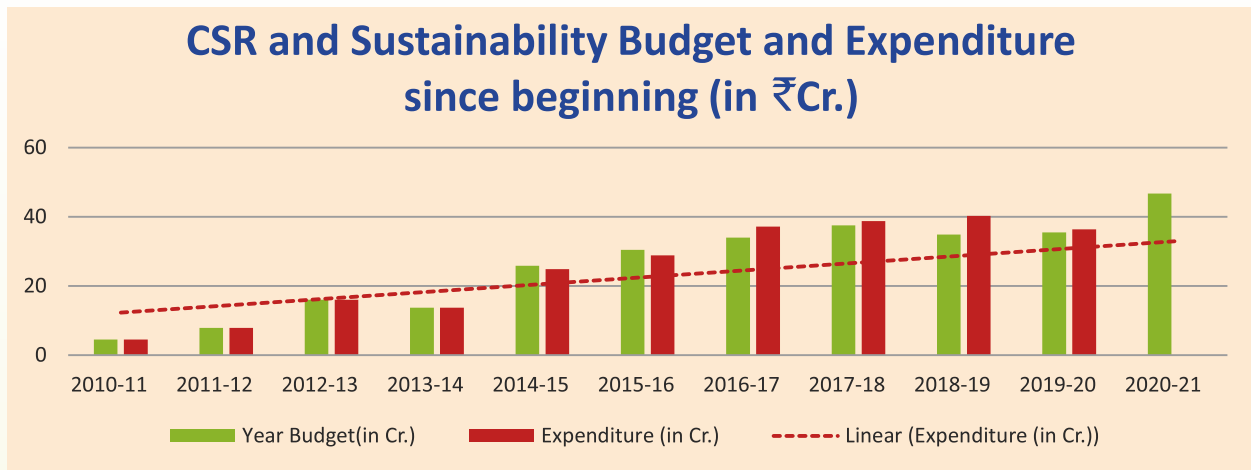

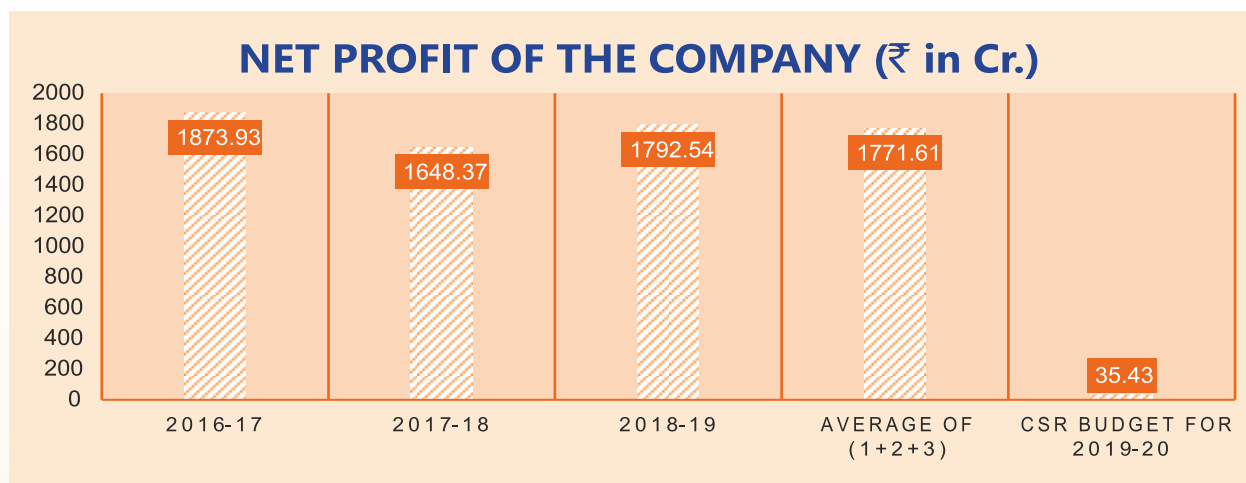

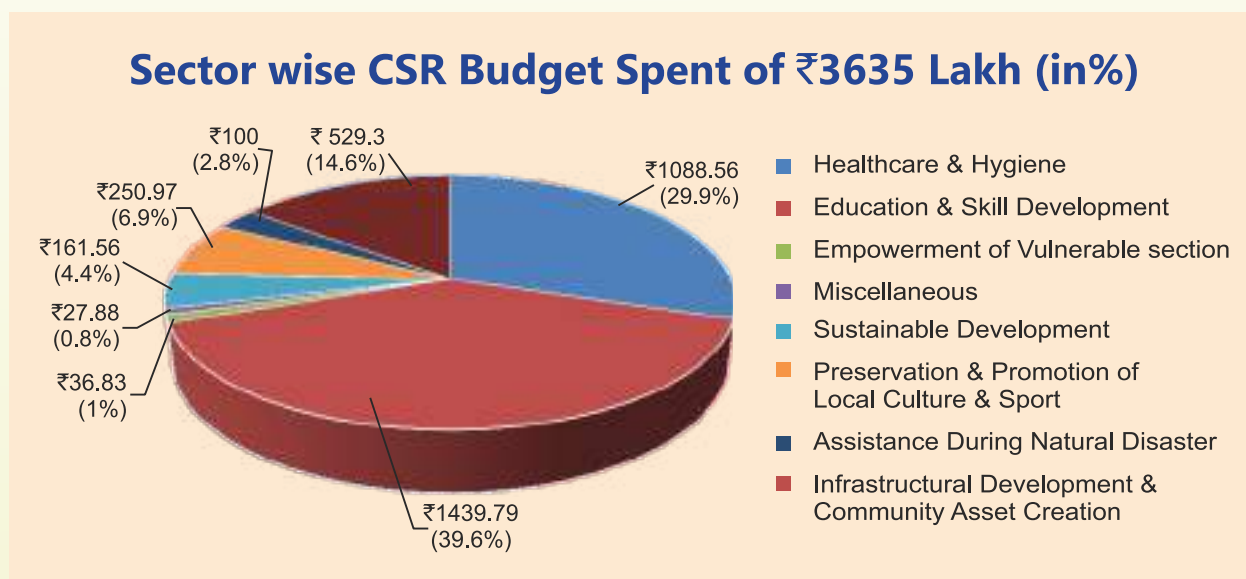
CSR Budget Plan FY 2019-20 and Expenditure.

1 HEALTH AND HYGIENE

The community health initiative in SJVN dates back to year 1995, when financial support of ₹8.00 Crore was provided to Himachal Pradesh Government for construction of 200 bedded Mahatma Gandhi Medical Services Complex (MGMSC)- Khaneri, Rampur (H.P). Presently this hospital offers services not only to project affected people but also to people from nearby districts such as Shimla, Kinnaur and Kullu. Even before the introduction of CSR Policy, Community Development Plan (CDP) for better health facilities for the local rural communities residing in far flung area, devoid of health care services and unable to afford medicinal cost, was implemented in SJVN. Such medical facilities include free medical care at project hospitals and

introduction of Mobile Health Van in year 2000 to cater medical services at the door steps of the local communities.

Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa-Health Care at door steps

Launched on the occasion of SJVN's Silver Jubilee in the year 2012. Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa (SSS) caters free medical care at door steps to the poor rural community around project areas in the states of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar and Maharashtra. 13 Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) manned with qualified medical staff (MBBS doctors, pharmacists, social protection officer) and equipped with basic diagnostic test equipments are dedicated for this health service. The MMUs are implemented through HelpAge India.

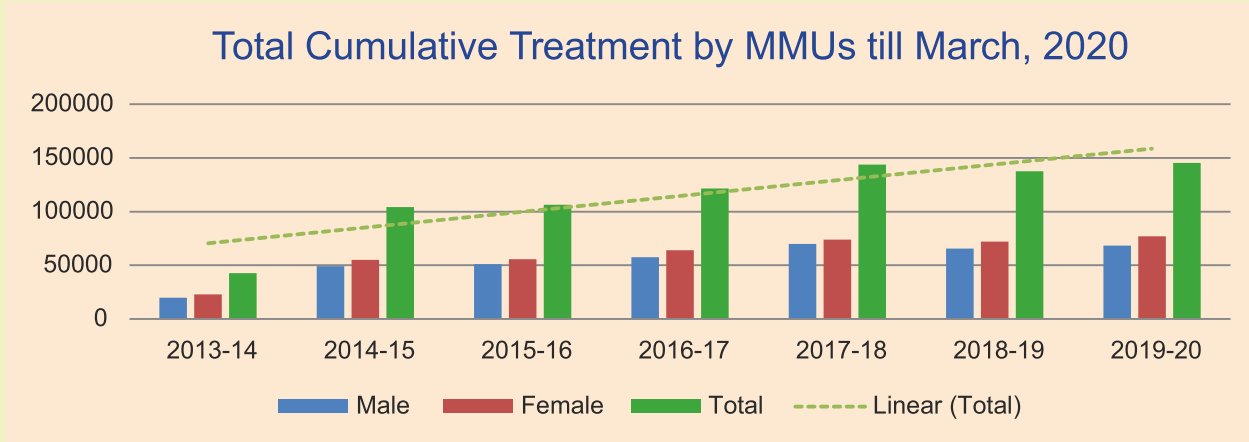


1,45,298 treatments have been provided during FY 2019-20 and total 7,99,243 treatments during last eight years by Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa

In addition of 13 MMUs, one MMU is being operated by company doctors and para medical staff in project affected areas at Rampur HPS. During FY 2019-20, 1090 people were provided treatments through this MMU.

Health Camps through HelpAge India

Specialized medical services are provided under CSR in areas of gynecology, ophthalmology, orthopedics, pediatrics etc. through health camps. For the FY 2019-20, an MOU was entered between SJVN and HelpAge India for conducting Health Camps with financial implication of ₹17,60,000/-.

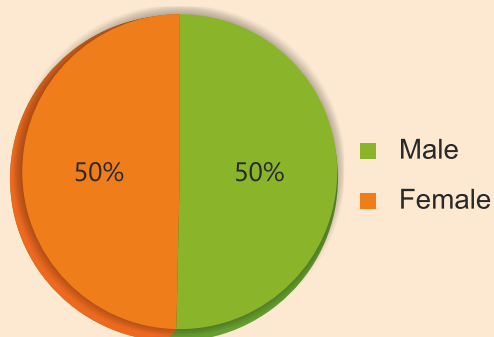

Ayurvedic Health Awareness Programs in Himachal Pradesh

As a measure to promote ancient Ayurveda based low cost health-care system, SJVN decided to continue to organize health awareness-cum-lifestyle program based on ayurvedic system. Accordingly, 500 ayurvedic camps were organized in FY 2019-20 around project areas through Bharatiya Dharohar with financial implication of ₹1.75 Crore.



75005 participants which include 38409 females and 36596 males were benefited through the awareness programs and showed interest to adopt Ayurveda based lifestyle. Details of camps are as follows:

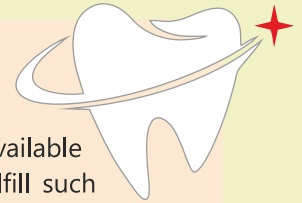

Physiotherapy Services at Rampur Project Hospital

Physiotherapy services have become an essential health care requirement in current times. Large number of people are now getting affected by physical disorders and are prone to such ailments. Such services are hardly found in hilly areas where people have to be dependent on local faith healers who sometimes make the situation worse. Seeing the urgent need, SJVN built a physiotherapy center for local people in project hospital at

Bayal. In the FY2019-20, total 1759 patient were benefited from this facility which also included 17 children.

SJVN Empowering Women of Weaker Section

Findings from new research reveal that the well-being of women depends on the intergenerational propagation of good physical and mental health of the children. Keeping this fact into account SJVN launched "Women and Child Development Scheme" in the year 2012 for Mother and Child health care and to align with Millennium Development Goals. The scheme was targeted to benefit women who come from BPL category in project areas and are in grim situation. As per the scheme, financial assistance of ₹5000 each is given during ante natal and post-natal period for proper nourishment of expected mother and infant. Along with this, a gift pack worth



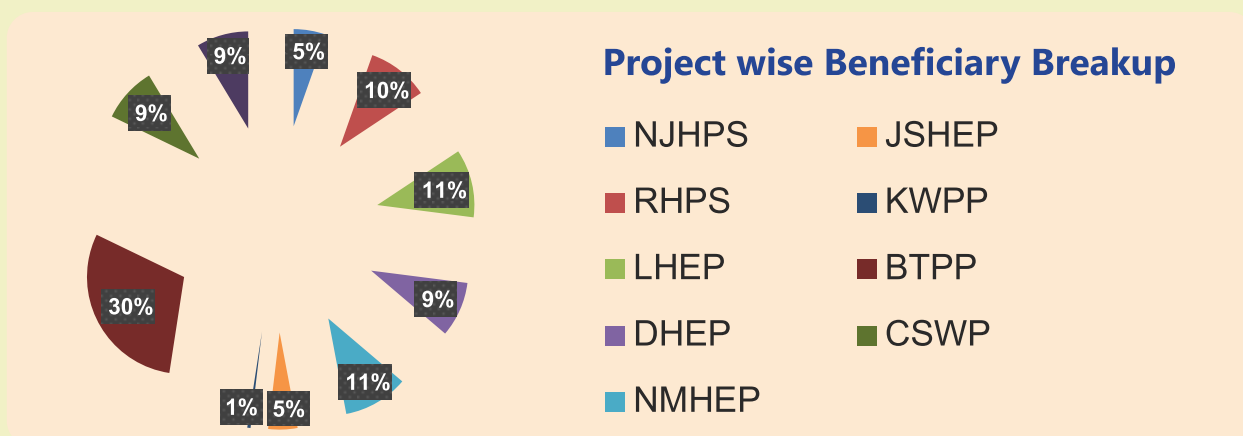
₹1000 comprising nutritional food, baby soaps, and other hygienic items etc. is also given during both consultations.

In the FY 2019-20, a total of 185 BPL women were benefitted from this scheme and total 867 women have been benefitted since 2012.

Financial Support for Construction of Rotary Ashray Near IGMC Cancer Hospital

SJVN extended financial support for construction of one floor of Cancer Sarai developed by Rotary Charitable Trust near IGMC cancer hospital for facilitating the stay of cancer patients and their attendants during medical checkup and tests.

Funds of ₹74,16,600 was approved by SJVN Foundation. Payment of ₹59,32,800 were released in installments and the last one will be released after the receipt of utilization certificate.

Health And Sanitary Facilities Around Buxar Thermal Power Plant (BTPP)

For addressing the various issues related to health, hygiene and sanitation of the people around BTPP, SJVN Foundation in its 28th Foundation meeting decided to extend financial support of ₹3,08,67,285 for different health and sanitation facilities details of which are as under:

To improve the health of youth and channelize their energy for creativity and to prevent menace of drug abuse, a proposal for gymnasium was sanctioned to Ramgaria Sabha, Lower Kaithu, Shimla with financial implication at ₹32,92,179. Approx. 150-200 local youth will be benefited by the Gym. So far the financial support of ₹6,58,400 as a first instalment has been released to the agency on 04.03.2020. The work is in progress.

Repair Work in Govt. Sr. Sec. School, Mehli, Shimla

To protect the school premises from intruders and for promoting cleanliness in school, SJVN Foundation sanctioned financial assistance of ₹9,52,685 which comprises of ₹8,17,000 for construction of boundary wall and ₹1,35,685 for repair of toilet and classroom to Govt. Sr. Sec.

School, Mehli Shimla. As on 31st March 2019, financial assistance of ₹6,66,880 has been provided to GSSS, Mehli in two instalments. Work is in progress.



2 EDUCATION AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT



An educated society is crucial for socio economic growth. The communities with higher literacy and skill enjoy better socio-economic standard. SJVN has implemented a number of education and skill development programs as the need of societies.

Sponsorship of Local Youth in ITIs for Vocational Training

To make the local youth capable of gainful engagement in economic activities, SJVN

has been sponsoring local youths to different Govt. ITIs. Apart from sponsoring the course fee of the trainees, SJVN also provides them monthly stipend of ₹2000/-. During FY2019-20, 111 students from project areas of NJHPS, RHPS, LHEP, DSHEP, JTJHEP & BTPP were supported to pursue ITI course in respective govt. ITIs. The details are as follows:

Deen Dayal Upadhyay SJVN Krishi Kaushal Yojana

Doubling of farmers income by 2022 is the objective of GOI. In support of this initiative, SJVN has entered into MOU with Dr. Y. S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Floriculture, Nauni and CSK University Palampur for imparting skill training to farmers in area of new agricultural technology, new scientific method of cultivation. Around 4200 farmers have already been trained since last three years and have seen substantial improvement in their income. During FY 2019-20, SJVN Foundation executed MOU with CSK HP Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, Palampur for organizing training programs for imparting training to farmers with specific focus on Zero Budget Farming in addition to general agriculture.



Further, to provide training to farmers who are unable to undergo residential training, SJVN provided farm training through local experts/agencies. In total 1079 farmers were benefited from these trainings and the details of the training programmes are as follows:

The latest development in the 6 ITIs are as under:

NJHPS: ITI Rampur Bushahr was provided amount of ₹49.92 Lakhs for laboratory/workshop items & computer/laptop, stationery items, class room items

& furniture and running additional trade of Computer Operator Programming Assistant (COPA) etc.

RHPS: ITI Nirmand and ITI Dalash have utilized ₹62.93 Lakh and ₹52.84 Lakh respectively on laboratory/ workshop items & computer/ laptop,

stationery items, class room items & furniture etc.

LHEP: The inauguration of building in ITI Kumarsain was done by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh on 14.10.2018. The institute has utilized ₹54.00 Lakh so far and plans to utilize the rest of fund in next two year. ITI Nainidhar has not been able to utilize any fund due to non-availability of road to the proposed site. It has received permission from Director (Elementary Education) to transfer the building and 05 Bigha land at Veergarh.

SJVN Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship Scheme

SJVN came up with Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship Scheme in the FY 2012-13 to inculcate competitive spirit among school students and motivating them to take up higher education in different streams. It is open to all meritorious student who secures at least 60 percent marks or equivalent grade in 12th class under State Education Board, CBSE or ICSE in the immediately preceding academic session in the States of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Maharashtra and Gujrat.



Reservation is given to students coming from BPL family and PWD candidates.

Selected students are paid a scholarship of ₹2000 per month till completion of their respective course. The whole process of identification, short listing and finalization is done by HIMCON which has been engaged by SJVN for implementing the SJVN Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship Scheme. Since its inception, 1537 students have benefited from this scheme. This year 150 students were shortlisted for receiving the scholarship in the five states.

For the state of Himachal Pradesh, scholarships were distributed among the students on 06.12.2019 at SJVN CHQ, Shimla by Hon'ble Governor of HP.

Similar functions were also organized in other states for distribution of scholarship. Details of scholarship given to meritorious student across states are as follows:

Vivekanand Organisation for Information, Communication & Empowerment

Prayas is an NGO engaged in the field of providing basic computer literacy to local people. SJVN has extended financial support of ₹19,10,690 to this NGO for setting up computer centres under the umbrella "VOICE" (Vivekanand Organisation for Information, Communication & Empowerment) centres in district Hamirpur, Himachal Pradesh. The centre provides free basic computer education to the local poor children to make them self-reliant. This financial support is being extended towards following infrastructural support:



1. Furnishing of training hall at ₹3,73,536;
2. Procurement of computer appliances at ₹11,80,154; and
3. Engagement of faculty for training initially for a period of three months at ₹3,57,000.

So far funds of ₹15,53,675 has been released to society against serial no.1 & 2.

Kanya Chhatrawas (Girl's Hostel)

SJVN Foundation is extending financial support of ₹1.85 Crore to Shri Dudhiya Baba Sanyas Ashram Rudrapur, Uttarakhand (being run and managed under the supervision of Sewa Prakalp Sansthan) for construction of hostel building for 180 orphan girls whose parents are inflicted with leprosy. So far funds of ₹1.60 Cr has been released in instalments. The building construction work is going on and after completion of the work, the balance payment will be released.



Ekal Vidyalayas

The Ekal Vidyalaya Mission is driven by Bharat Lok Shiksha Parishad which aims to provide education in rural areas where poor children have no access to schools on the principle "One School, One Teacher". During the year 2019-20 SJVN has provided financial support of ₹20,000/- each to 100 Ekal Vidyalayas.

Construction of Hostel block in Himachal Pradesh National Law University (HPNLU).

As a measure towards women empowerment SJVN Foundation has sanctioned financial support of ₹10.85 Crore to Himachal Pradesh Law University (HPNLU), Shimla for construction of girls' hostel block. An MOU has been executed between SJVN Foundation and HPNLU, Shimla on 29.11.2019 in the presence of Hon'ble Chief Justice of Himachal Pradesh. So far, 50% amount has been released and the work is under progress.



Medhavi Chhatra Utsav in Distt. Kinnaur

In order to promote education and sportsmanship among the youths in tribal and far flung areas of HP, the meritorious students / sportspersons were awarded in Medhavi Chhatra Utsav held in Village Jangi, Distt. Kinnaur under Jangi Thopan Hydro Electric Project, Jangi.

Total reward value of ₹21,37,000 was distributed by SJVN Foundation among 366 students / sports persons in the following categories:

- I. The meritorious students from all schools of distt. Kinnaur;
- II. Sports persons; and
- III. Girls of Jangi village pursuing technical education, professional courses and Post-Graduation or Masters Degrees.





Installation of Grid Connected Solar Power Plant in GHSS Munderi, Kannur.

With an aim to promote infrastructure development and modern facilities to increase the enrolment and improve modern amenities in Govt. schools Munderi, Kannur, Kerala, SJVN Foundation has executed MOU on 16.11.2019 with District Panchayat, Kannur for installation of Grid connected Solar Power Plant in the school with financial implication of ₹66.85 Lakhs. As on March, 2020, 1st instalment of ₹26.74 stands released to GHSS, Kannur.

Handloom Weaving Trainings to Weavers and Artisans, Through HP State Handicraft & Handloom Corporation

As per CPSE conclave target, SJVN planned to promote 50 start-ups by 2022. To achieve this target, SJVN has partnered with HP State Handicraft & Handloom Corporation for setting up 20 handloom weaving unit in project areas of NJHPS, RHPS, LHEP, JTPHEP, DSHEP and NMHEP and aspirational district Chamba. In this regard, MoU was signed between SJVN Foundation and HP State Handicraft & Handloom Corporation Ltd on 04.03.2020. The total cost of this project is ₹112.00 lakhs and the first instalment of ₹33.60 lakhs has been released on 20.03.2020.



As per the MOU, HP State Handicraft & Handloom Corporation Ltd will provide training to 200 people by organizing 20 training programmes in project areas of SJVN in HP. After the training the looms will be provided to all 200 participants to start their own units.



Awareness On Citizen's Duties And Fundamental Duties

To create awareness among general public about Indian Constitution and Citizen Fundamental Duties, Department of Justice has directed all CPSUs to prepare a calendar of events starting from 26th November, 2019 to 26th November, 2020 for undertaking different activities such as speech/debate contest, distribution of pamphlet, seminars, rally etc. Accordingly, SJVN prepared a calendar



of different awareness activities and is implementing them across all project locations. Major events like constitution day, republic day have been celebrated in all project location in which different competitions were organized.

Apart from this local community were educated about constitution and its different parts regularly through pamphlet distribution, street plays, quiz competition in schools etc. More than 4000 people so far have been participated under this campaign. The program will continue up to 26th November, 2020.



Aids and Appliances for Children with Special Needs (CWSN) under “Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan”

In order to promote education, SJVN extended financial support to State Project Director (ISSE), Shimla to meet the gap funding required under Samgra Shiksha Abhiyan. It is a scheme introduced by MHRD to facilitate the retention of Children with Special Needs (CWSN) studying in general schools. An assessment was conducted by ALIMCO in 12 districts of HP which revealed that around 12348 CWSN are studying in various govt. schools of HP and 3696 CSWN have been assessed for Aids and Appliances. The total financial implication of providing aids and appliances as per the invoice raised by ALIMCO was ₹55,59,539.20. However, the budget approved by GOI was ₹34,60,000 and hence on the request of SPD (ISSE), Shimla SJVN Foundation extended the financial support ₹20,99,539.20 to meet gap funding.

Creation of Library Facilities in Prisons of Himachal Pradesh

Himachal Pradesh Prisons are known for correctional endeavors and rehabilitation for their prisoners. It encourages inmates to take up education as a result of which hundreds of inmates are enrolled in open schools and open universities and pursuing various courses.

To promote healthy literary environment in prisons of Himachal Pradesh, SJVN has extended financial support ₹5,00,000 for creation of library facility. The amount has been utilized for purchase of books, installation of wooden / steel racks for display of books and purchase of reading table and chairs.

Skill development training for kins and dependents of widows of army persons in Himachal Pradesh

With the objective of socio-economic rehabilitation of widows of army persons, their kins and dependents, SJVN Foundation has initiated capacity building and income generation program. 50 women, 25 each in Beauty Parlour and Cutting and Sewing were imparted training with financial implication of ₹5, 80,000.



3 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT



Restoration of water bodies

In order to make access to water adequate and equitable, we must shift our focus from water sources to water resources or say water bodies. Owing to large scale urbanization, ground water recharging has been severely affected leading to acute shortage of water during summers. In hilly areas due to the mountainous terrain, ground water recharging does not happen and all rain water goes wasted. To tackle this issue, SJVN over the years has supported villagers in the vicinity of its project areas in building tanks and rehabilitation of existing water bodies like springs, ponds etc. During the FY 2019-20, 13 water bodies were undertaken for restoration as under:

Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan

Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan is the national campaign driving 'Clean India: Clean Schools'. A key feature of the campaign is to ensure that every school in India has a set of functioning and well-maintained water, sanitation and hygiene facilities in order to form a healthy school environment and to develop appropriate healthy and hygienic atmosphere. SJVN has taken host of initiatives by providing safe and hygienic environment in school through construction of toilets.

Maintenance of toilets constructed under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan

For maintenance of 2421 toilets constructed under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan a lumpsum annual maintenance amount up to ₹5000 per toilet is provided to the schools for general maintenance

like repair, change of cistern, sheet, tap, wash basin, doors, water tanks, other sanitary fitting, white washing, painting etc. In the FY 2019-20, as many as 45 schools have been provided the maintenance funds at total of ₹1,94,147.

Construction of toilets in Shanti Niketan Chhatrawas, Dagshai

Shanti Niketan Chhatrawas, Dagshai distt. Solan H.P provides shelter to 36 children of



backward areas by way of free boarding, lodging and education. In order to augment basic facilities, SJVN extended support of ₹9,79,600 for toilet construction to Shanti Niketan Chhatrawas, Dagshai.

Installations of LED based Solar Lighting in U.P.

With a view to promote clean and green environment an MoU was signed with EESL for installation of LED based solar street lights and high mast lights in Deoria, Sahjanpur and Lucknow East U.P. The details of the same is as under:

The installation of all the solar light have been completed.

Sansad Gram Adarsh Yojana, Village Simas, Tehsil Lar Bharol, distt. Mandi

Financial support was sought as a gap funding for development of village Simas, Tehsil Lar Bharol, distt. Mandi under Sansad Gram Adarsh Yojna. Under the proposed plan, the following development works are being taken up:

1. Construction of Multi-purpose Hall
2. Construction of Mahila Mandal in 1st floor of Panchayat
3. Channelization of Nallah near Simas temple
4. Installation of 3 high mast lights

SJVN Foundation decided to extend the financial support of ₹70,23,663 and accordingly consent letter for extending the financial support was issued to BDO, Chauntra on 08.07.2019. The work is being executed through Gram Panchayat Simas. The first instalment of ₹28,09,465 has been released to BDO, Chauntra on 13.03.2020. The work is under progress.

Installation of LED based Solar street lights and Dustbins in Himachal Pradesh

With a view to promote clean and green environment at the behest of MoP, Gol proposal was received from EESL for providing solar street lights and dustbins in 23 constituencies of Shimla and Mandi district of Himachal Pradesh. The project was envisioned to be executed out of CSR funds of the power sector PSUs. Accordingly, EESL had prepared and submitted the proposal as below:

1. Supply, installation, commissioning of 5,750 LED based Solar Street Lights (12 W) with 05 Years Warrantee & Maintenance.
2. Design, supply, installation, commissioning of 23,000 Sets of Dustbins (110 Ltr. capacity each) with 01Year Warrantee.

So far installation of 2014 solar street lights have been completed in 9 constituencies and for the remaining constituencies, it is in the process of physical site verification and payment of ₹5,05,65,337 stand released.

The installation of 23000 pairs of dustbins have been already completed and accordingly payment of ₹10,18,56,420 has been made to EESL.



Observance of Swachhta Pakhwada

Inspired by the Hon'ble Prime Minister's call for Swachh Bharat, SJVN took various initiatives under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. SJVN observed Swachhta Pakhwada from 16th May to 31st May 2019 at all its offices and project sites located in Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh and Maharashtra with host of Swachh Bharat activities having long term impact in the society. A brief detail of different swachhta activities undertaken during the Pakhwada are as under:

- 1. Swachhta Pledge:** Swachhta Pledge was observed by all employees of SJVN across all offices and project location in the state of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh, Maharashtra, Gujarat and Delhi.



- 2. Renovation of Iconic places:** For undertaking swachhta initiatives on long term basis, SJVN has adopted various iconic places for restoring its rich heritage through renovation and construction activities. Major iconic places adopted are as under:

- a. Bhima Kali Temple, Sarahan, Shimla.
- b. Devta Nagela Temple complex, Kullu.
- c. Tattapani, H.P
- d. Durga Mata Temple, Kullu
- e. Deondar Temple, Chaupal, Shimla.



- 3. Cleanliness drive:** Cleanliness drive were taken up in Shimla and in and around projects located in H.P, Uttarakhand and Bihar. Following iconic places were also taken up during the drive:

- a. Sankat Mochan Temple, Shimla (H.P.)
- b. Nath Baba Temple, Buxar (Bihar)
- c. Hari Das Baba ki Kutiy, Chausa(Bihar)
- d. Kulsari Devi Mandir, Tharali (Uttarakhand)



Further villagers were motivated for shramdan drive for cleaning of villages and were asked to devote at least 100 hours per year towards Swachhta Drive.

- 4. Construction of Toilets in village, schools and iconic places:** Two Public toilets have been constructed along National Highway at Jhakri through Sulabh International.

- 5. Installation of Dustbins and distribution of sanitary napkins in schools:** Dustbins for collections of dry and wet waste have been distributed in schools and other locations in and around projects. Sanitary napkins were distributed among school girls and they were also made aware on menstrual hygiene. Sanitary napkin vending machine and incinerators are also being provided to the schools.



- 6. Awareness drive on Swachhta:** Awareness on swachhta was done in various schools and project affected panchayats by organizing nukkad natak, motivational speeches, swachhta rally, painting competitions etc.

An inter School Quiz competition "Prakriti Khoj" was organized for schools in district Shimla and Solan to create awareness among school children on environment protection. 78 teams from Govt. and public schools participated in the competition.



7. Program on river cleanliness and drug abuse:

With a view to protect the flora and fauna around the rivers sides, river cleaning drive were undertaken at the following locations:

- a. Satluj river at Nathpa dam, H.P
 - b. Ganga Ghat surroundings at Buxar, Bihar
- Moving a step further SJVN took first of its type step towards creating awareness to keep the rivers clean by organizing "Satluj Aradhana" and similarly extending the same to other rivers (like river Pindar in Uttrakhand) where its projects are located.



- 8. Pledge on 'World No Tobacco Day':** Pledge on 'World No Tobacco Day' on 31st May, 2019 was observed in all offices of SJVN. Sensitization sessions were also organized on drug abuse among employees in all offices of SJVN.

Observance of "Swachhta Hi Sewa" Campaign

On the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, "Swachhta Hi Sewa" campaign, 2019 was observed from 11.09.2019 to 02.10.2019 as a mark of tribute to Mahatma Gandhi. As per the



direction of MoP, the activities were undertaken in all SJVN offices and work sites during the period of campaign under following categories:

1. **Public Awareness activities:** Awareness campaigns for banning the use of single use plastic, door to door meetings to drive behavior change for use of plastic, speech/ slogan/ drawing competition in schools on banning of plastic etc.
2. **Tree Plantation and other activities:** Plantation of trees, promotion of plates and bowls made from leaves, distribution of jute bags to women and children of the project areas etc.
3. **Shramdan activities:** Cleanliness drive by collecting waste including the plastic waste is undertaken during the period of campaign.

1. **Public Awareness activities:** Awareness campaigns for banning the use of single use plastic, door to door meetings to drive behavior change for use of plastic, speech/ slogan/ drawing competition in schools on banning of plastic etc.

4 INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT AND COMMUNITY ASSET CREATION

Infrastructural services are essential for better inter-societal and institutional connectivity and to unite with the mainstream of the nation. SJVN Foundation under its CSR vertical "Infrastructural and community development" for infra development activities such as construction of school buildings, hospitals, roads, bridges, public toilets, bus stands, public parks, play grounds etc. The selection and execution of these activities is carried out with the participative involvement of village development area

committees, school management committees, panchayats, community-based organizations etc. so as to bring transparency and to develop sense of ownership amongst the users.

Construction of community assets in project areas

During the FY 2019-2020, 82 community assets were taken up for construction, out of which 52 assets have been completed and 30 assets were in different stages of construction.

Construction of ambulance road in village Kawalag in Gram Panchayat, Pujarli, District Shimla

Financial support of ₹10.00 Lakh was sanctioned for construction of ambulance road in Gram Panchayat Pujarli out of which fund of ₹8.00 Lakh has so far been released.

Renovation of Public Parks in Lucknow (East), UP

SJVN Foundation has extended financial assistance of ₹43,97,800 to Uttar Pradesh Gramin Awas Parishad (Gramya Vikas Vibhag) for renovation of 13 parks in Lucknow, UP. The agency has fully utilized the funds for renovation of these parks and completed the activity.

Financial support for construction of crematoriums in Gram Panchayat

Pagog

The last rites with dignity is considered to be a societal obligation. Based on societal need, SJVN Foundation provided financial assistance of ₹5,67,000 for construction of three crematoriums for gram panchayat, Pagog, Shimla (HP).

Financial support for the construction of hostel building for Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Shimla (HP)

Himachal Shiksha Samiti, Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Vikasnagar, Shimla had requested for financial assistance for construction of buildings for Saraswati Vidya Mandir schools at various places in HP. After receipt of detailed estimate from Samiti, the committee visited the site and recommended for extending financial assistance of ₹2,33,90,071 for construction



of hostel block in Saraswati Vidya Mandir, Vikasnagar, Shimla. The payment was released in three instalments. After completion, the inauguration of the hostel building was done by Hon'ble Chief Minister of H.P on 21.06.2019 in the presence of Director (Personnel) SJVN Ltd.

Financial support for furnishing of ground floor of "Research and Rehabilitation centre" for differently abled persons

With a view to rehabilitate differently abled persons Chetna agency had requested to provide financial assistance for construction/ furnishing of ground floor of Research and Rehabilitation centre for differently abled and deprived section of society at Village Vijaypur, Pargana, Gehrwin, Tehsil Jhanduta, Distt. Bilaspur (H.P). SJVN Foundation has provided financial support of ₹1.00 Cr. to Chetna to complete the ground floor work.

Financial support for construction of Multipurpose Medium Height Dams for water conservation in Nahan (HP)

Water conservation is considered to be wise method for equitable distribution and supply of water. Executive Engineer, I&PH Division, Nahan, Distt. Sirmour has requested to extend financial support for construction of multipurpose medium height dams in Gount village Nahan H.P as a measure towards water supply and maintain water level.

The SJVN committee after examination of site



recommended to extend the financial support of ₹57,39,160 Accordingly, consent letter has been issued to Executive Engineer, Jal Shakti Vibhag, Nahan, Distt. Sirmour (H.P) So far payment of ₹10,55,441 has been released.

Financial support for renovation work in Harihar Mandir, Vikasnagar, Shimla (HP)

Harihar Mandir Nirman Samiti Vikasnagar, Shimla (HP) requested to provide financial assistance for renovation work in Harihar Mandir Nirman Samiti building at Vikasnagar, Shimla. The temple discharges social services like free medicines to poor persons. Accordingly, committee was formed and based on the recommendation of the committee financial support of ₹5 lakhs have been extended to Harihar Mandir Nirman Samiti. The work has been completed.

Financial support to GSSS Cheog, Theog, Shimla, for Sports infrastructure

SJVN Foundation with a view to promote sports among school children, helping them to participate at various national and international level sports events and reduce the use of drugs in youths through engagement in sports, extended financial assistance to GSSS Cheog for constructing various infrastructural items as under:

5 PRESERVATION AND PROMOTION OF LOCAL CULTURE AND SPORTS

For construction of power projects, large chunk of private land are acquired from local community for different project components. SJVN believes that the rehabilitation of affected families not only improves socio-economic standard but also joins them with main national stream. To ensure that people do not feel alienated from their land and inculcate sense of cultural harmony and festive mood, SJVN has always promoted local culture, festivals, sports in the local area. In its efforts, it has promoted national and local festivals like International Lavi Mela at Rampur, Summer Festival at Shimla, Dussehra festival at Kullu, Hamir Utsav at Hamirpur, Kinnaur Mahatsav at Kinnaur etc.

During FY 2019-20 an amount of ₹72.26 Lakh spent on promotion of local culture and sports.



Development, renovation and reconstruction of Bhimakali and Tara Mata temple complexes

Financial support of ₹1.00 crore and ₹2.00 crore each has been extended for repair and reconstruction of Bhimakali Temple complex at Sarahan and Tara Mata Temple at Shimla in the year 2017. The renovation/ reconstruction of these two premises have been undertaken exclusively as per the Pahari architecture in wooden style. The renovation/ up gradation work of Tara Devi is completed.

In Bhimakali temple installation of new hydrant to safeguard the temple building from fire has been done and works such as painting, white washing & minor repairs of main temple and Raghunath temple Sarahan are in progress. A new park has also been proposed by the temple trust for which estimate has been sent to Commissioner (Temple) for administrative and Technical approval.

Construction of Bathing Ghats and Mela Ground at Tattapani, Sunni

Hon'ble Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh during his tour to Sunni and Tattapani announced the construction of Bathing Ghats and Mela ground for the pilgrimages. He entrusted SJVN for the same and accordingly LHEP took up the case with local authorities. An estimate of ₹1,05,71,756/- has been recommended by the committee for the construction of multipurpose stadium at Tattapani which will be extended in three instalments. Utilization of fund is being monitored by committee consisting of officials from LHEP and GoHP. 1st Instalment of ₹31,71,526/- in favour of SDM, Karsog has been handed over to Hon'ble Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh on 14/01/2019.

Development of four Cultural Heritage Sites of Himachal Pradesh

Under "Apni Dharohar Apni Pehchan" drive of GoI, GoHP had requested SJVN to take up development of few cultural heritage sites of natural importance in Himachal Pradesh. Accordingly, out of the 29 listed sites, SJVN adopted four heritage sites. An MOU dated 25.02.2019 has been entered by SJVN Foundation with Department of Language and

Culture (LAC), H.P. for development of the four cultural heritage sites with the total cost of ₹25.00 Lakh for each site, which are as under:

1. Sapni Fort, Sangla, Kinnaur
2. Parshuram Temple Complex, Nirmand
3. Kaka-Shimla Railway, Kalka and
4. Chhitkul village, Kinnaur

The layout prepared/ designed for the above heritage sites has been requested along with modus operandi, implementing agency, payment mode etc. for taking further necessary action. The proposal for the following has been received so far:

- A proposal of ₹93.10 Lakhs has been received from Department of Language and Culture (LAC), Shimla. A committee from NJHPS visited the site and has recommended to release the funds of ₹25,00,000/- to the Piri Killa Nirman Prabandhan Committee, Sapni. Accordingly, after the approval of Competent Authority payment of ₹25.00 Lakh was released to the agency. The work is under progress.

Support for construction and repair of 'Anand Shikhar Sadhnalaya', Banuti, Shimla

Yogada Dhayan Kendra, The Ridge Shimla, runs a mediation centre under the umbrella of 'Anand Shikhar Sadhnalaya', situated at Banuti, Shimla. It is a spiritual retreat for the devotees who come together for regular group meditations and other spiritual activities aimed at mental health and cultural practices. On request received from Yogada Dhyan Kendra for financial support, a committee was constituted to examine the proposal. The committee recommended financial support of ₹14,47,926/- to Yogoda Sansthan in three instalments for the construction and repair works of the meditation centre. 1st instalment of ₹5,79,170/- had been released on 19.11.2019.



Financial support towards construction and repair work at Chambu Devta Temple Complex Jhakri, Distt. Shimla

Financial support of ₹2 Cr has been approved for renovation, upliftment and repair of Chambu Devtaji temple complex at Jhakri as a step to restore the cultural heritage of the area. The foundation stone of the temple was laid by CMD, SJVN on 11.04.2019 and the inspection of the ongoing work was done by Director (Personnel)-cum-Chairman SJVN Foundation on 07.10.2019. The work of renovation, uplift and repair of temple complex is in progress. Total sanctioned amount of ₹2.0 Crore has been released. The work is under progress.

Construction of Shri Kali Temple at Deonder and railing around Temple

Secretary Shri Kali Temple, Deondar Tehsil Chaupal, District Shimla had submitted a proposal for construction of the temple complex and railing work around the temple premises. A committee visit was done from SJVN and as per the recommendations, financial assistance of ₹50,54,197/- was extended to Mandir committee. The construction/renovation work is being done with the help of registered architect. As on date first instalment of ₹20,21,678 stand released to the temple. The work is under progress.



6 ASSISTANCE DURING NATURAL DISASTER

Natural disasters such as earthquake, floods, cloud bursts, draughts, cyclone and forest fire are frequent phenomenon which brings a host of issue including humanitarian, public health, environmental, infrastructural besides loss of human lives. SJVN has always been in the forefront in providing relief assistance to the victims of natural calamities. The support is extended by providing relief materials, infrastructure support directly to the victims or through contributing to the Government funds such as State Disaster Management Funds, PM CARES Fund etc.

viz. landslides, floods, avalanches, fire accidents etc.

Construction of fuel & fodder storage shed

During stone laying ceremony of NMHEP Hon'ble Minister of State (I/C), Ministry of Power, GOI directed to provide financial assistance of ₹15.00 Cr. for construction of fodder shelter for poor rural families enabling them to protect livestock and fodder which are generally burnt in rural houses.

The estimate of ₹13,28,20,269/- for construction of 3579 fodder sheds was submitted by Disaster Management Authority, Distt. Uttarkashi (UK). Accordingly, MOU was entered with District Administration (UK) by NMHEP on 15/01/2019 and 1st instalment of ₹5.00 Cr. was released. The work of the construction of fuel and fodder storage room has been awarded by Rural Works Deptt. Uttarkashi and the work is under progress.

So far, status of construction of 1153 wood/ fodder storage sheds for which award was made by Rural Deptt. Uttarkashi is as under:

The GOI has formulated the "Transformation of Aspirational District "initiative in January 2018 aiming to improve India's ranking under Human Development Index. The initiative has been taken for bridging the gap between developed and underdeveloped districts termed as Aspirational Districts. Based on the directions issued by DPE, SJVN has been allocated district Chamba under aspirational district program. Accordingly, SJVN has approached district administration, Chamba for taking up developmental projects based on annual common CSR theme. The projects are being monitored jointly by SJVN and representatives of DC, Chamba.

Theme : School Education, Healthcare & Nutrition

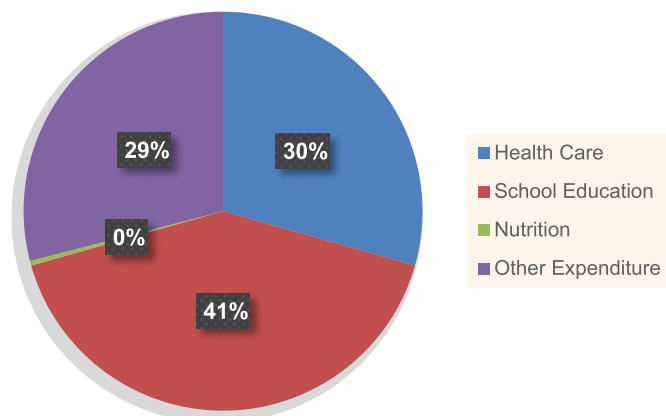
The annual theme for FY 2019-20 was "School Education, Healthcare & Nutrition" and accordingly SJVN is extending financial support to district administration, Chamba for infrastructure development in areas of School Education, Healthcare & Nutrition in the district. The component wise breakup of the activities is as follows:

The above medical equipment were considered for speedy diagnosis of TB patients and cataract patients. Large number of houses in Chamba have anemic patients hence nutritional and health was considered.

As per the statutory guideline issued by DPE 60% of the annual CSR budget should be spent on activities covered under the annual theme. 70.99% of the CSR budget for FY 2019-20 has been utilized on the annual theme. Hence SJVN has achieved the target set by DPE.

THEME: School Education and Healthcare

The annual theme for the year FY 2018-19 was School Education and Healthcare and the project taken up on the given theme in aspirational district, Chamba in FY 2018 have continued in FY 2019-20. The details of the project taken up are as under:

- a. Construction of Schools Buildings:** Due to absence of schools in nearby location, high drop rate among school children have been observed. SJVN with the support of district



administration is constructing 17 primary school buildings situated in 10 blocks of district where school dropout is a common phenomenon due to absence of school in nearby location.

This project will benefit the schools of 10 remote blocks of District Chamba namely Sundla, Salooni, Chowari, Kallhel, Tissa, Hardaspura, Chamba, Gehra, Pangi and Bharmour. At present, construction works in all 17 total schools are in progress which is regularly monitored by Education Department and also jointly by SJVN and representatives of DC Chamba.

The total cost of this project is ₹261.66 Lakhs for



construction of 17 Units @ ₹15.39 Lakh per Unit and each unit includes - 2 rooms with site development, playground, boundary wall, toilets and kitchen sheds. Till now ₹184.67 Lakhs have been released to DC, Chamba.

- a. Health Infrastructure:** SJVN received proposal from District Administration, Chamba for following health care facilities with the overall cost of ₹139.80 Lakhs:

Initially we contacted Govt. Hospital Indore and were told that this is incurable disease and my son will be completely on bed in the age of 12-16 years. I got very disturbed and then somebody told about IAMD-Solan. My child was unable to work, walk and climb stairs. I attended the IAMD Camp and this institute is doing wonderful work, my child's confidence level increased and now he feels better and more confident after treatment. I am very thankful to IAMD Staff, Nurse, Doctors and Physiotherapist and always pray to GOD that nobody should have such diseases. I am thankful to donators and institutions like SJVN and others for providing financial support to such institutions."



Miss Akshita Jain D/o Smt. Pravitra Jain, resident of Jaipur, Rajasthan. 10 years ago, we came to know that my daughter is suffering from Muscular Dystrophy. We have a Child Doctor in family so

it was very difficult to accept that my daughter is suffering from Muscular Dystrophy but later on everybody understood about it. I came to know about IAMD-Solan from Dr. Sharvam Jain. It is beyond the expectations. Everybody at this institute is so nice and caring and they helped in encouraging my daughter's self-confidence. IAMD told us that we should never feel that our child is disabled. They take care of their patients like a MOTHER. I am grateful to the efforts of IAMD-Solan. I am also very grateful & thankful to the organisation like SJVN Limited for providing financial support & help to such institutions in bringing latest technologies and research works to the overall benefit of the society.

FARMERS SKILL DEVELOPMENT TRAININGS

Sh. Daljeet Singh is the resident of Kullu district and engaged in farming since long. The village though on the bank of Beas river but still the farms are rainfed as there is no provision for water lifting and storage. The farmers first built the water storage tank and then adopted drip irrigation system for irrigating pomegranate. Still, he was using straight fertilizers as he did not have knowhow about the fertigation. He came in contact of institution and after initial survey programme and skill training programme he was guided about use of fertilizers with drip irrigation system and use of plastic mulch for saving water and labour cost. The institute get his soil tested for nutritional assessment and recommended the use of fertigation system according to the report. Initially he was given 10 kg black plastic mulch (100 micron) to encourage him for using mulching. Polyethylene mulching helped in better moisture conservation and about 13-15% water saving as compared with only drip irrigation. WSF has also helped in reducing usage of fertilizers by about 15%. Farmer is able to save ₹15,000/- per year on fertilizers besides an increase of income of ₹1.50 lakh/year on account of improvement in fruit quality and production.



After seeing the results of fertigation and mulching for himself, he has now purchased one quintal of plastic mulch for his remaining trees and is using water soluble fertilizers for fertigation. The farmer is very thankful to the University and SJVN Limited.



Sh. Bhuvnesh Sharma, resident of Village Kandraur, Tehsil Sadar, Bilaspur (H.P.). Main Crop: Capsicum and carnation/Polyhouse. The farmer despite being well educated could not get government job, therefore he decided to try his hand in agriculture. Dr. Y. S. Parmar University of Horticulture & Forestry, Solan suggested protected cultivation as good alternative for getting high returns. Though, initially he had problems of marketing the capsicum but through his hard work he solved the problem and was able to get good returns.

The farmer also started growing coloured capsicum initially and earned ₹1.5 lakh in the second year itself. By the end of third year he has recovered the cost of polyhouse. The farmer came in contact of the institute through skill development training programme sponsored by SJVN Limited. Now, Sh. Bhuvnesh Sharma only concentrates on cultivation under polyhouse. He cultivates capsicum in the polyhouse and take suggestions and directions from the Institute during crop period.

As of now, he is able to produce 120 quintals of coloured capsicum in the year. He also started marketing of crop directly to the retailers and therefore saved commission to the agents. After 3 years, he shifted to carnation cultivation under polyhouse. He is not only producing good quality carnation but also earning well.

Sh. Bhuvnesh Sharma is very thankful to the Professors, Counsellors, & Trainers of the University and SJVN for providing Skill Development Training and also requests to continue such skill development training programmes for farmer's development & better earning in future as well.

CONSTRUCTION OF SCHOOLS IN ASPIRATIONAL DISTT. CHAMBA

District Chamba of Himachal Pradesh has been listed as one of the aspirational districts in the country and SJVN has been allocated district Chamba for carrying out various developmental activities / works.

The far flung areas of district Chamba are devoid of infrastructural facilities particularly in the area of education and hence, the children lacks in access to education and gets engaged in other household/ domestic activities. Accordingly, SJVN in coordination with local administration has extended financial support for construction of 17 schools units in 9 educational blocks of distt. Chamba namely Sundla, Salooni, Chowari, Sihunta, Kalhel, Tissa, Hardaspura, Chamba and Gehra.

As on date, most of the schools buildings have been completed and are ready to welcome the children in the wonderful world of education.

CLOSING REMARKS

For the financial year 2019-20, SJVN Foundation was provided with CSR budget of ₹35.43 Crore and the total spent was ₹36.35 Crore. The CSR budget was spent on key activities under CSR verticals identified as per schedule VII of the Companies Act, 2013 and it was a matter of great satisfaction that the Foundation was able to meet up the needs and aspiration of local population in and around the project areas.

In health and hygiene, the mobile medical arm 'Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa' was able to reach out to as many as 1.45 Lakh of patient spread across its project areas in states of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar and Maharashtra. Currently 13 MMUs are being operated through HelpAge india across the projects and since its inception it has offered services to 7.99 Lakh patients.

Besides this year 10 specialized health camps were organized through HelpAge India benefiting 3397 patients and 500 ayurvedic health camps benefiting 75000 people.

Apart from above services, SJVN has built its own healthcare facilities in Projects. The dental clinic services and physiotherapy services are being offered to people around the project. Both these services are offering free services to all the people and has been widely acclaimed by the elderly who have to deal with muscular and Physio issues due to old age and nature terrain. This year total 1326 patient were offered dental care and 1759 patient were offered physiotherapy through project facilities.

SJVN is continuously extended financial support to key medical institution in further upgrading their medical infrastructure. It has been providing financial support to Indian Association of Muscular Dystrophy (IAMD) for construction of an Integrated Muscular Dystrophy Centre at Solan and IGMC Shimla for construction of Rotary Ashray which is a cancer sarai for attendants of cancer patients.

In health indicators, MMR and IMR has always been important which directly reflects the soundness of health services of any nation. To address the high MMR and IMR of country, SJVN had launched women and child development scheme in 2012. Under this scheme it has been promoting post and ante natal check-up in order to ensure safe delivery among poor women. It is offering financial assistance of ₹5000 to every such women along with a nutritional kit of ₹1000 in both check-ups. This year 185 women benefited from the scheme.

When it comes to empowering local people and youth to enhance their skill and thereby paving way for new source of income generation, SJVN has continued its focus on providing skill training to youths, farmers and women in different areas.

This year 1079 farmers were trained in area of Zero Budget Farming and general agriculture through special trainers and agriculture institutes such as CSK HP Krishi Vishwa Vidyalaya, Palampur. For youth skilling MOU with NSDC has been signed for skilling 4200 youths in different trades which are in high demand among industry. It has also entered into MOU with HP State Handicraft & Handloom Corporation for promoting local artisans and establishing 20 handloom units in project areas.

For promotion of education and adding motivation to school children in taking up higher studies, SJVN has been providing financial assistance to students in their higher studies through SJVN Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship Scheme since 2012. This year 150 students were offered scholarship for higher education across all project areas.

Apart from scholarship scheme, the company is also operating reward scheme for school students of govt. schools and sponsoring students of govt. ITIs. This year, 543 topper students of Govt. schools of project areas were rewarded. For pursuing ITI course in govt. colleges, 111 students were sponsored.

Further under education, the company has been providing assistance in infrastructure and other aids such as promotion of Ekal Vidyalayas, construction of hostel blocks in Himachal Pradesh National Law University (HPNLU), installation of grid connected Solar Power Plant in GHSS Munderi, Kannur, and Kerala, distribution of Aids and Appliances for Children with Special Needs (CWSN) under "Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan", creation of library facility in Prisons of Himachal Pradesh etc.

Over the years SJVN has built and shaped thousands of infrastructures like school, buildings, roads, public parks, crematoriums, check dams, playground etc. In this area, as many as 82 community assets were taken up for construction in the project areas.

Under sustainable development, SJVN has been taking up the issue of Swachhta Hi Sewa through construction and maintenance of school toilets under swachh vidyalaya abhiyan and observance of swachhta pakhwada. This year also Swachhta Pakhwada was observed with great zeal and

enthusiasm in all offices. Activities like Swachhta pledge, cleanliness drive, installation of dustbins etc. were undertaken. Apart from these the company has been doing activities like restoration of water bodies, installation of solar street lights etc. in its project areas.

To promote and preserve the local culture, the company has been supporting and renovating temple of local importance such as Bhimakali, Tara Mata temple, Chamu Devta Temple, Shri Kali Temple. It has also adopted four heritage sites of cultural importance in states of Himachal Pradesh which includes Sapani Fort, Sangla, Kinnaur, Parshuram Temple complex, Nirmand, Kaka-Shimla Railway, Kalka and Chhitkul village, Kinnaur.

This year under assistance during natural disaster, the company contributed to HP Mukhya Mantri Rahat Kosh and undertaken construction of fodder/ Wood storage room for victims of fire in local village of Uttarkashi districts at Uttarakhand.

Apart from activities under different identified verticals other activities were also undertaken this year. SJVN has taken district Chamba under aspirational district programs and has taken activities

on the theme School Education, Healthcare & Nutrition. In this activity such as creation of school of school building in remote blocks, setting of library and different medical infrastructure like mobile van etc. are being taken up.

The company has tied up with IIT Mandi for promotion of a vibrant start up and innovation ecosystem in the state and in the Himalayan region for which it has offered financial assistance of ₹2 lakhs to IIT Mandi Catalyst for Himalayan Startup Trek 2019.

The company took special initiative out of its CSR budget in arranging funds for combatting sudden outbreak of novel CORONA virus and has been provided assistance to medical institutions and its staffs through medical infrastructure support and protective gears such as mask, PPE kits, gloves and sanitizers.

SJVN and its CSR SJVN Foundation will continue to stand with society to make it a better place to live. For the year 2020-21, SJVN Foundation has been provided a budget of ₹46.67 Crore for undertaking various ongoing and new activities.
