It is holistically beneficial to all the stakeholders, society, planet as well as the organization. The holistic extent of CSR activities depends upon company size as well as its profits. CSR and Sustainability Framework in SJVN

SJVN has formulated and adopted a well-designed CSR and Sustainability Policy initially framed as per CSR guidelines issued by DPE and further revised from time to time as per Government guidelines. Presently, the CSR and Sustainability Policy has been revised as per the provisions laid under the Companies Act, 2013 and the CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Rules notified by MCA in the pursuit of the aforesaid Act. Based on the provision kept under the aforesaid Act, the Annual CSR and Sustainability Budget Plan is kept equal to 2% of the average in last three years net profit of the company and the plan is





recommended by board level committee of directors on CSR and approved by the Board.

The guiding principle behind the selection of CSR programs in SJVN encompasses the activities enumerated under Schedule VII of the Companies Act 2013. By following such principles, SJVN has embarked upon CSR programs on health & hygiene, education and skill, women empowerment, infrastructure, community development, sustainable development, promotion of culture, protection of heritage & sports, assistance during natural disasters, rural development, support to incubators, R&D etc.

The CSR programs are primarily executed in operational areas of SJVN in India i.e in Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar, Gujarat and Maharashtra & Uttar Pradesh.

SJVN CSR and Sustainability Policy

The Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) and Sustainability Policy of SJVN was initially formulated based on the CSR guidelines issued by Department of Public Enterprises, GoI in 2010 and approved by the BOD in its 208th meeting held on 30.11.2011. Further, based on the Companies Act 2013, Companies (CSR) Rules, 2014 and further amendments, the policy has been revised 04 times. The latest i.e. fourth revision of the CSR and Sustainability Policy of SJVN was approved by BOD in its 304th meeting held on 22.12.2022. CSR Verticals and Annual Plan

For reaching out to the societal needs and based upon the Millenium Development Goals, human rights of national eminence CSR projects SJVN has formulated CSR verticals in line with Schedule VII of Companies Act 2013. The budget outlay is provided under each vertical to all the concerned projects and spent on various CSR activities. Depending upon the needs under different segments, the budget provision is reviewed and reframed on yearly basis. The CSR activities of SJVN are undertaken broadly in the following six verticals:

- Sustainable Development

CSR & Sustainability Budget and Expenditure Overview

SJVN being a socially responsible corporate citizen has always been very proactive in undertaking activities for the welfare of the society. SJVN started formulating a defined budget for CSR and Sustainability activities from the FY 2010-11 which was much before the introduction of Government guidelines under the Companies Act 2013. The budget provision over the years has increasing more than 13 times i.e. from Rs.

4.5 Cr. in FY 2010-11 to Rs. 59.84 Cr. in FY 2022-23. The actual expenditure has also increased many times and in FY 2022-23, the expenditure has surpassed the statutory budget by up to 164.13%. Over the past 13 years, Rs. 412.64 Cr. has been spent on various CSR activities. An overview of CSR and Sustainability Budget as well as expenditure since beginning i.e., year 2010-11 is as follows:

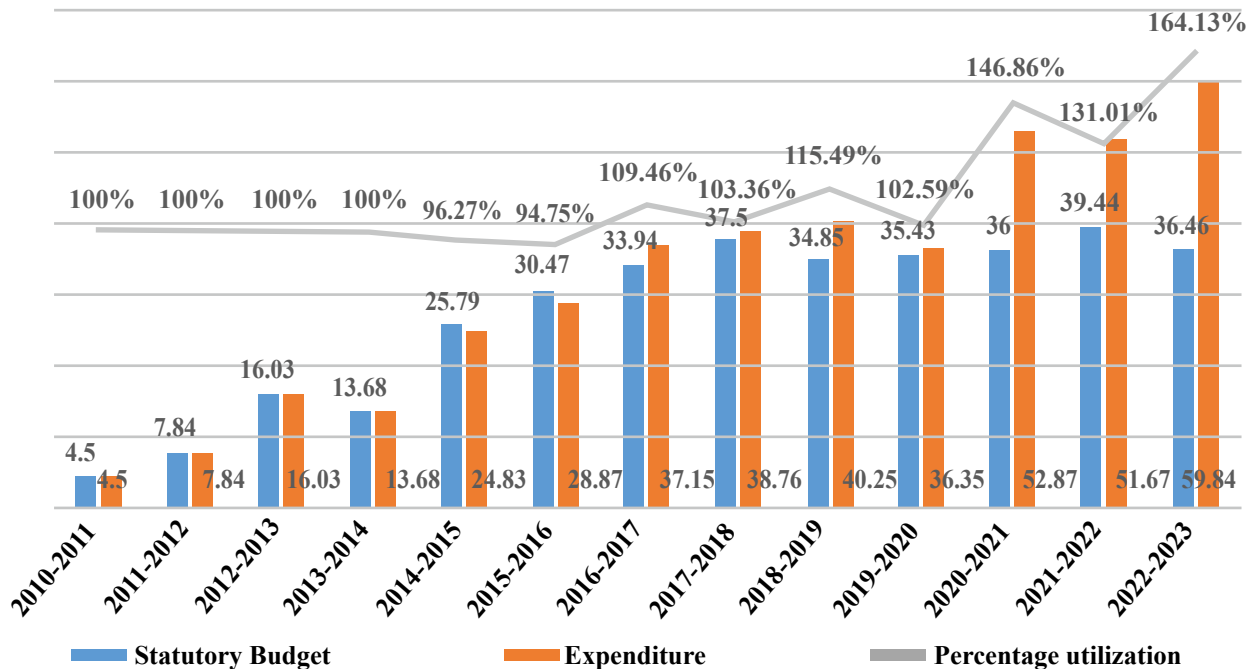

CSR and Sustainability Budget and Expenditure Since beginning (in Rs. Cr.)

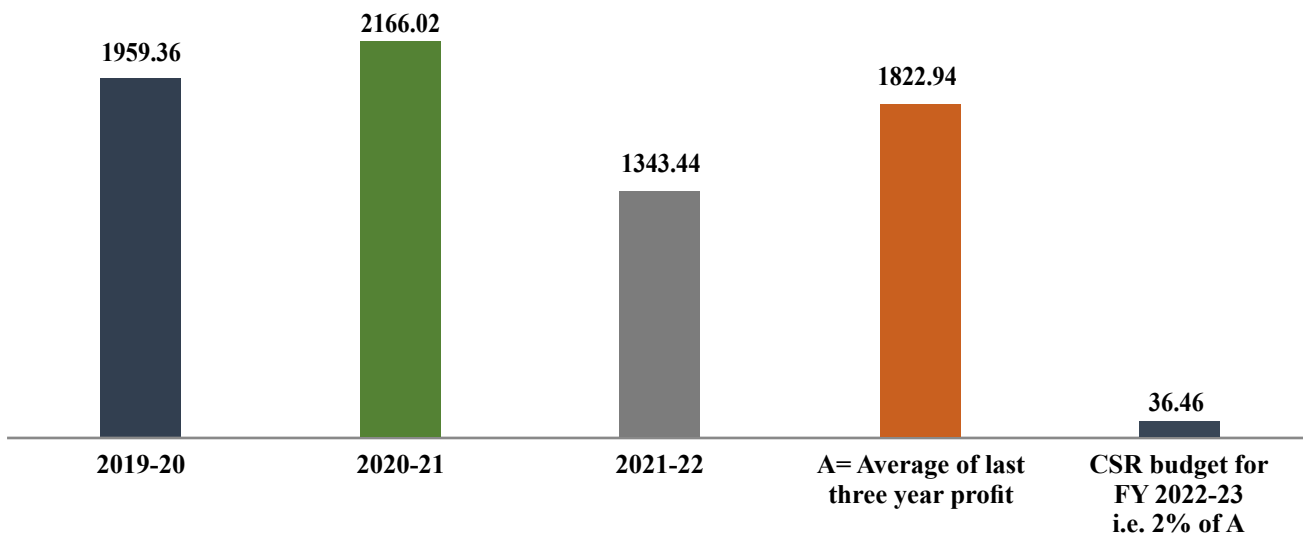


The table and graph clearly show increasing trend in CSR expenditure

CSR Budget Plan FY 2022-23 and Expenditure

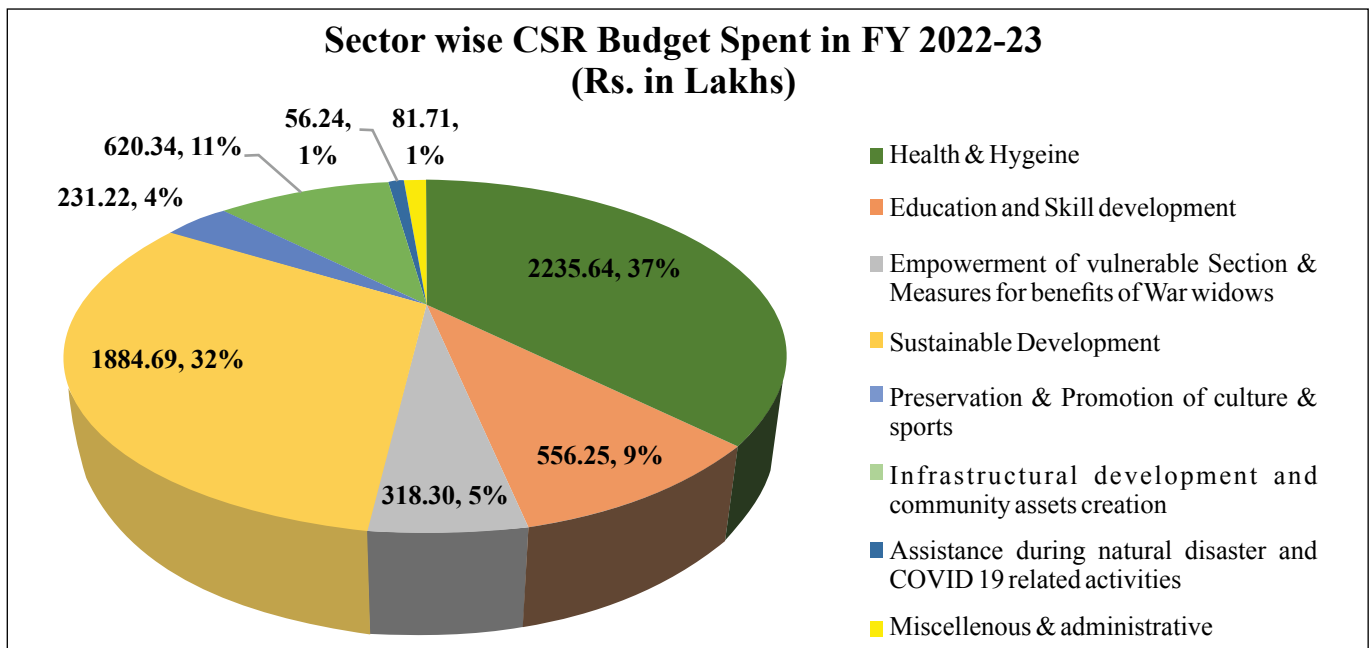
Net Profit of SJVN for the last three financial years is depicted below:

Profit of the Company and Statutory CSR Budget for FY 2022-23 (Rs. in Cr.)



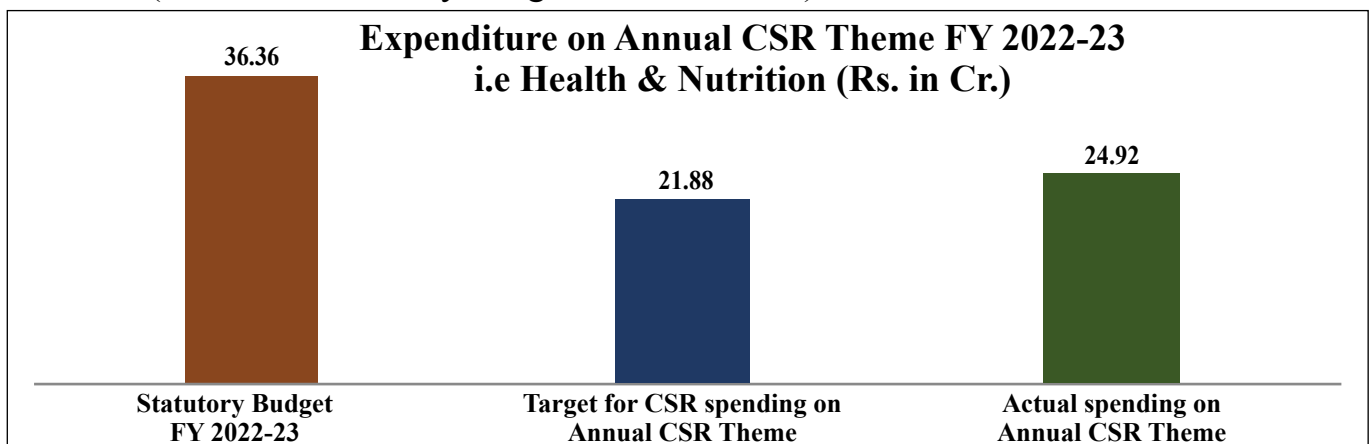


Based on the CSR & Sustainability Budget procedures stipulated under The Companies Act, 2013, the statutory budget for FY, 2022-23 i.e., 2 % of average of last three years net profit was Rs. 36.46 Cr. However, the Board of Directors had initially approved a budget of Rs. 53.23 Cr. for FY, 2022-23. Further, in view of unforeseen and need based CSR works BOD approved additional amount of Rs. 7.00 Cr. Thus in FY, 2022-23, an amount of Rs. 59.84 Cr. was spent against the statutory budget of Rs. 36.46 Cr. Hence, expenditure for the year surpassed the statutory budget provision by 64.13%. The sector wise graphical representation of CSR expenses is given below:



CSR expenditure on Annual CSR Theme

Every year Department of Public Enterprises (DPE) circulates an Annual CSR Theme for spending CSR budget. As per guideline of the DPE 60% of the statutory CSR budget for a financial year is to be spent on “Annual CSR Theme” and for FY 2022-23 the Annual CSR theme was “Health and Nutrition”. SJVN has spent Rs. 24.92 Cr. against the target of Rs. 21.88 Cr. (i.e. 60% of Statutory Budget of Rs. 36.46 Cr.).

Major CSR and Sustainability Initiatives in FY 2022-23

1. Health and Hygiene- Lets make the world a healthy place to live

SJVN is mostly implementing its projects in very remote rural areas where there is scarcity of basic health infrastructure. CSR initiatives under this vertical includes organizing of health camps, operation of mobile medical units, extending of treatment facilities at project hospitals, financial support to distt. hospitals, support to Central/State funds, PM Care fund etc. To boost the sanitation and cleanliness infrastructure, SJVN has been actively participating in the national initiatives such as Swachh Bharat Mission, Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan with a view to provide safe and clean environments for overall well being of communities. Further, as per DPE guideline, 60% of the statutory CSR budget for a financial year is to be spent on "Annual CSR Theme" and for FY 2022-23 the Annual CSR theme was "Health and Nutrition". SJVN has fully complied with

this statutory requirement for the year. The various healthcare, sanitation and nutrition facilities/activities extended/organized by SJVN foundation are detailed as under:

Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa – Health Care at door steps

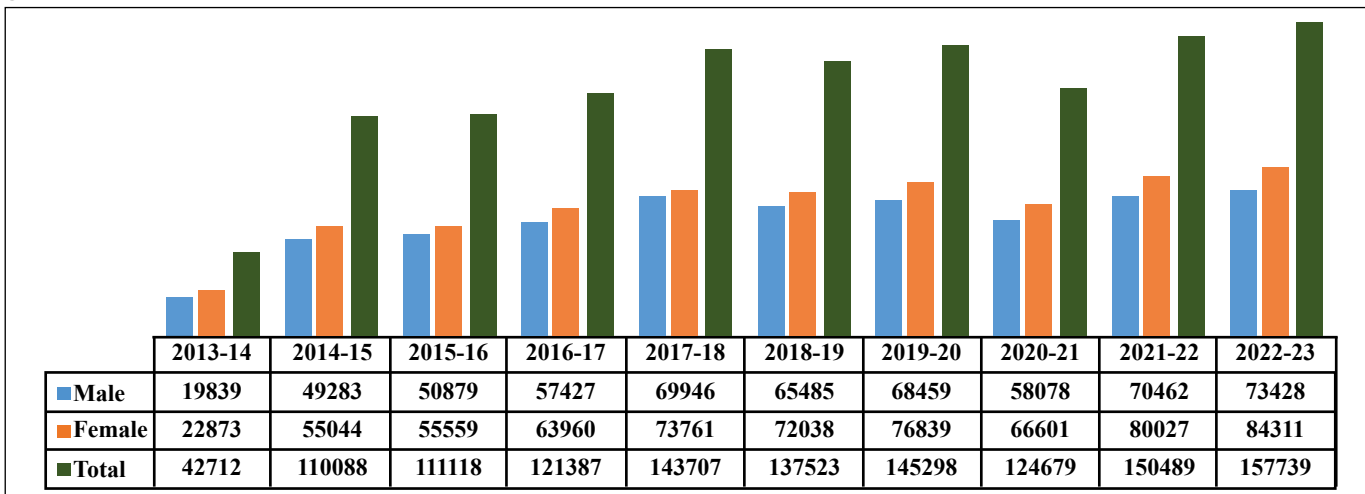
Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa has proved to be a life saver amongst the people living in the remote rural areas. The Scheme was launched in 2012 on the occasion of SJVN's Silver Jubilee. The fleet of 14 Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) (now 13) manned with qualified medical staff (MBBS doctors, pharmacists, social protection officer) and equipped with basic diagnostic test equipment caters to the free medical care at the door steps of the poor rural communities around project affected area in the states of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar and Maharashtra. The MMUs are being operated through HelpAge India on the behalf of SJVN Foundation. Detail of cumulative treatments provided through MMUs till 31st March 2023 are detailed below:

In addition to 14 MMUs (now 13), one MMU is also being operated by company doctors and para medical staff in project affected areas of Rampur HPS.





MMUs through Dhanush Foundation:

Buxar Thermal Power Project (BTPP) is operating six Mobile Medical Units in the project area through an NGO named Dhanush Foundation. The project authorities have entered an MoU with Dhanush Foundation for Running and Maintenance of 06 MMUs under "Chikitsa Chikitsak Aapke Dwar" Program. The services of MMU were commenced with effect from 17.05.2021 and covered the areas of Brahampur, Buxar, Dumraon, Rajpur, Ramgarh and Dinara. In the FY 2022-23, Rs. 50 Lakhs have been spent on the running and maintenance of the 06 MMUs. Till 31.03.2023, the six MMUs provided treatments to 26516 patients comprising of 12227 females and 14289 males.



Health Campaign through Mobile Medical Units:

In addition to providing health care facilities to the people through Mobile Medical Units, SJVN Foundation has also been organising awareness sessions, General Health camps and specialized health camps in the project affected areas through HelpAge India. The details of General health camps and awareness session on COVID-19 organized in FY 2022-23 are as under:

Health camps in Project areas

During the FY 2022-23, 15 Specialized Camps and 16 Multi-Specialized health camps have been sanctioned to be conducted through Open Hands Welfare Society in the states of H.P. and Uttarakhand. The health check-ups of the beneficiaries were done by Gynaecologist, orthopaedics, paediatrician, MD Medicine. Besides above, free medicines were distributed to the patients

and special awareness sessions were also organized for women in which they were made aware about the cause and prevention of uterus cancer.

As on 31.03.2023, out of 31 camps 24 camps have been organized benefitting 3322 patients (1561 male and 1761 female) and remaining 07 camps are under process. The details of the camps organized are as under:

In addition, 02 specialized medical health camps at the cost of Rs. 1.56 Lakhs were organized at village Khombhalne and Khirvire, Maharashtra in which total 209 people were benefitted.



Ayurvedic Health Awareness Programs

As a measure to promote ancient Ayurveda based low-cost health-care system, SJVN has long been organizing health awareness-cum-lifestyle camps based on ayurvedic system of medicine. Ayurvedic health awareness programs aim to educate individuals about Ayurvedic principles, practices and





lifestyle choices that can support optimal health. An NGO named Bhartiya Dharohar was roped in to organize the camps in Himachal Pradesh, UK and

Bihar. As many as 1930 ayurvedic health awareness camps have been organized for the last five years benefitting more than 2.32 Lakhs people as per the following details:

In FY 2022-23, a total of 600 camps have been organized around the project areas in Himachal Pradesh, Bihar, and Uttarakhand at a financial implication of Rs. 224.36 Lakhs benefitting 72040 people (37334 Males and 34706 Females).

Dental Care Services in Rampur HPS Area

Dental care is one health aspect which we often tend to ignore till the problem aggravates. Facilities of dental care are not very common in remote areas. In order to provide the services, SJVN has been operating a dental clinic at the Project Hospital of RHPS since 2014. The clinic is open to the people of project affected areas and the company employees and members of their families as well. The patients are being given specialized treatment at the clinic ever since. Since the start of its operations 8483 patients have been benefitted till 31.03.2023, through this clinic while during the financial year 2022-23 itself, more than 1207 patients have been treated. Details of patients treated during the year are as under:

Physiotherapy Services at Nathpa Jhakri and Rampur Project Hospital



Physiotherapy helps people to get rid of suffering from injuries and body inability. Such services are hardly found in hilly areas where people are generally

dependent on local healers who sometimes make the situation rather worse. A major obstacle in proper treatment was non availability of a physiotherapy clinic in & around the company's projects. Seeing the urgent need, SJVN has established physiotherapy centres for locals at its Rampur Hydro Power project hospital at Bayal and Nathpa Jhakri Hydro Power project hospital at Jhakri. These centres have benefitted about 14,153 patients suffering from arthritis, chronic backache, spinal or stiff neck problems, accident issues, sports injuries or post-surgery complication. The details of the beneficiaries in both the centres till date are mentioned in the table below:

X-Ray Services in Rampur HPS Area



X-Ray machines are commonly used to examine the bone fractures, breaks etc. However, in the remote locations, these services are generally either not available or available at very distant locations. Keeping in view the need of such facility, RHPS has undertaken an initiative of starting an X-ray facility in Project hospital Bayal to cater to the need the local people. The X-ray facility is equipped with modern technology machine. In the FY 2022-23, a total of 262 patients comprising of 51 males and 211 females have been benefitted with the services at project hospital.





Contribution to PM Cares Fund

SJVN being a responsible corporate citizen has always been keen to extend financial support to national level funds for relief of the people effected due to any disaster. Considering the common CSR theme of FY 2022-23 i.e. Health & Nutrition and in order to fulfil its social obligation towards the nation, SJVN has contributed Rs. 12.00 Cr. to PM CARES Fund for strengthening the fight against corona, its variants and other health related measures.

Construction of Gymnasium at Ramgarhia Sabha, Shimla



To improve the health of youth, channelize their energy for creativity and to prevent menace of drug abuse, SJVN foundation came forward to provide financial assistance of Rs. 37.21 Lakhs to Ramgarhia Sabha, Shimla for construction of a gymnasium building. Further, on the request of the Sabha and based on the SJVN committee report, additional financial assistance of Rs. 20.28 Lakhs was sanctioned for finishing work of the gymnasium building. The full sanctioned amount of Rs. 57.49 Lakhs stands released to the Sabha and the work is completed.

Ni-Kshay Mitra- A Program for TB patients in Jhakri

Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GOI under the initiative of Pradhan Mantri TB Mukh Bharat Abhiyaan has implemented a program named “Community supports to TB patients- (Ni-Kshay 2.0)” for effective engagement of the community in the path towards ending TB in India. Under scheme the individual, companies etc. can adopt the patients at least for a period of six months and will bear the expenses of nutrition food basket.

With a view to support the noble cause, SJVN has adopted the 30 TB patients in Nichar block of Distt. Kinnaur, HP which falls under the project-affected area of Nathpa Jhakri Hydro Power Station. SJVN Foundation through Nathpa Jhakri HPS is providing the financial support of Rs. 1,50,000 for providing food baskets on a monthly basis to these patients for one year.



Financial Support for Shiksha Learning Centre at Narvana khas, Kangra, H.P

Usha Mahajan Memorial Social Service Organization is running a Shiksha Learning Centre at Narvana khas, Kangra in H.P where the education and the Medical Aid is

b. Financial assistance of Rs. 3.02 Lakhs provided to CHC Santalpur for purchase of medical equipment such as Defibrillator Machine (1 No.), Suction Machine (1 No.), Stretcher (2 No.), Wheel Chair (2 No.) and Cupboard (Almirah) (3 No.).



c. DHEP Tharali under its CSR initiatives provided financial assistance of Rs. 2.23 Lakhs for installation of Automatic Haematology analyser in CHC Tharali.

Sanitation

Mahatma Gandhi has said "Cleanliness is next to godliness" and "Sanitation is more

important than independence." India is a country having huge population with people having diverse economic background. It has been observed that remote rural areas are generally deprived of the basic sanitation facilities and urban areas face a lot of pressure on sanitation facilities due to very high population density. The poor cleanliness & sanitation conditions are always a hindrance towards the development of the country. In order to overcome this, GOI has launched "Swachh Bharat Mission" with a view to spread the awareness of cleanliness and its importance. Accordingly, to provide the basic infrastructure for sanitation and support to the Swachh Bharat Mission, SJVN under its CSR initiatives has been continuously providing various financial and infrastructural support to the government agencies, local bodies, schools etc. During the FY 2022-23, SJVN has spent Rs. 155.07 Lakhs for various works related to Swachh Bharat Mission such as Swachhta Pakhwada, construction and maintenance of toilets in and around its project areas etc. The few activities under sanitation are summarized below:

Swachhta Pakhwada 2022

SJVN has been promoting cleanliness since long and has been undertaking various projects such as construction of toilets, cleanliness drives, beautification of public places etc. Under Swachh Bharat Mission, as per the directions of MoP, GoI SJVN observed Swachhta Pakhwada from 16th to 31st May 2022 at its Corporate Headquarter Shimla, project locations and other offices across India.





To propagate the message of Swachhta, SJVN conducted various activities during the Pakhwada across its all-project locations and offices in India such as awareness campaigns, special drive to encourage eco-friendly material instead of plastic, tree plantation drives, installation of dustbins in public places and cleaning up of rivers situated nearby Projects area, distribution of sanitization/personal hygiene materials in local communities, competitions and awareness programs etc. A brief detail of different swachhta activities undertaken is as under:

- a. **Pledge:** To mark the commencement of the Swachhta Pakhwada 2022, the pledge was administered in all the project offices and locations of SJVN. In addition, the Swachhta pledge was also administered by NJHPS in Govt. Senior School Jeori and GSS Jhakri to motivate the students to use eco -friendly materials in daily life instead of plastic materials.



- b. **Cleanliness Drives:** SJVN conducted cleanliness drives at its projects/offices, public places, heritage buildings associating the local Mahila Mandals, School Students etc. The drives have proven to be a successful way of creating

awareness about Cleanliness and to clean the surroundings involving the community. The cleanliness drive was conducted at slum areas of Shimla in association with HelpAge India at Rajhana, Jakhu temple, Shimla, Surya Narayan Temple, Nirath, Market Complex Jagatkhana in Rampur, Randal village in Rampur and other areas around SJVN project offices.



- c. **Swachhta Awareness Campaigns:** During the pakhwada various awareness campaigns related to swachhta were/being organized which includes expert talks, nukkad natak, pamphlet distribution, awareness through mobile loud speakers etc. These campaigns benefitted approx. 10,000 persons in the state of H.P, Uttarakhand, Gujrat, Maharashtra & Bihar. During the campaign masks, gloves, sanitization

material, Sanitary pads, Hygiene Kits etc. were also distributed amongst the school students, local people, Mahila mandals etc.



d. Installation of Re-cycle / Non-recycle dustbin: SJVN while observing the swachhta pakhwada across its project locations and offices has generously donated / installed dustbin of recyclable and non-recyclable waste with a message of Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan. A total of 251 No. dustbins were installed/ distributed in consultation with local administration.



e. Awareness through social media and other media: The activities conducted under Swachhta Pakhwada were regularly updated on the official facebook and twitter page of SJVN so as to reach out the message of cleanliness to the general masses. In addition, the

message of swachhta was also spread through local news channels.



f. Tree Plantation Drives: To clean the environment and spread the message of complete cleanliness of environment, tree plantation drives in association of locals, school children etc. have been conducted by SJVN at its various offices/locations. In addition, potted plants of varied species were also provided to govt. schools.



g. Discouraging the use of single use plastic: To discourage the use of single use plastic and promotion of eco-friendly material jute bags have been distributed amongst the mahila mandals and local people in Luhri HEP-1, Bithal and Sadla Wind Power Station, Gujrat. Also, Nathpa Jhakri HPS, Jhakri distributed recycled paper bags among Panchayat representatives of the nearby panchayat of NJHPS and employees of SJVN.





SJVN through Buxar TPP in association with a cooperative society, JIVIKA, Patna has setup a sanitary pad manufacturing unit at Chausa, Buxar Bihar. The total cost of the project is Rs. 56,68,799/- out of which SJVN has partly funded an amount of Rs. 30,00,000/-. The sanitary pad manufacturing unit will be helpful in providing low-cost but good quality sanitary pads to the women. These initiatives will help Lakhs of females residing in the region towards maintaining their personal hygiene and cleanliness.

h. Debate/Declamation/Essay writing Competitions in Schools: To create awareness and spread knowledge, various debate and declamation contests have been conducted in schools in the vicinity of project/office areas of SJVN such as Debate competition on “स्वच्छ भारत स्वप्न है अपना” at GSSS Portmore, Shimla, declamation competition on “स्वच्छता-भक्ति से बढ़कर” NJHPS at Govt. Senior Secondary School Nigulsari, an essay writing competition on “स्वच्छता ही सेवा” at GIC Mori, UK.



Installation of Sanitary Pad Manufacturing Unit

SJVN Foundation has undertaken an initiative for generating employment and providing better personal hygiene related facility for improving the health of women.

Construction and maintenance of Toilets under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan

SJVN with a view to create awareness and provide the hygienic environment in the govt. schools, under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyan had constructed 2420 toilets in H.P, UK, Bihar and Arunnachal Pradesh. Later, on the directions of Ministry of Power, SJVN conducted a third-party survey of all the 2421 toilets constructed by SJVN under





Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyaan in which 253 toilets were found dysfunctional.

Accordingly, repair work in the 253 dysfunctional toilets was started and as on 31.03.2023, 184 toilets have been repaired as well as handed over to the concerned local authorities. The balance 69 toilets in Arunachal Pradesh are under repair. Prior to this, for the maintenance of these toilets SJVN was providing lump sum annual maintenance amounts up to Rs. 5000/- per toilet per year for general maintenance like repair, change of cistern, seat, tap, wash basin, doors, water tanks, other sanitary fitting, white washing, painting etc.

In addition, financial assistance of Rs. 26.85 Lakhs released in favour of Bihar Education Project Council (BEPC), Patna for 90 additional toilets constructed under Swachh Vidyalaya Abhiyaan in Bihar.

Construction of Sulabh Toilet in Rampur, Shimla



Access to hygienic toilets in public places have been accepted as essential need specially for health, sanitation and women dignity point of view. Due to this in the 33rd COD it was decided to identify such locations on the highways and major roads around Satluj, Beas and Chenab Basin. In

compliance to the decision in COD and as per the societal felt need a location near Mahatma Gandhi Medical Services complex Khaneri Tehsil Rampur Bsr. Distt. Shimla (HP) was identified which was lacking proper toilet facility. Hence, after taking necessary permissions from the local authorities, a MoU was signed on dated 26.07.2021 between SJVN Foundation through Nathpa Jhakri HPS and Sulabh International Social Service Organization, Patna for construction of Sulabh shauchalya toilet block including care taker room and site development near Mahatma Gandhi Medical Services complex Khaneri Tehsil Rampur Bsr. Distt. Shimla (HP) at the cost of Rs. 50.93 Lakhs. The work of the construction of the toilet has been completed and full sanctioned amount of Rs. 50.93 Lakhs has been released in 03 instalments out of which the final instalment of Rs. 10.19 Lakhs released in FY 2022-23.

Other toilets Constructed in FY 2022-23

Based on the societal felt need, SJVN has constructed toilets at various locations benefitting more than 5000 people. The details of few toilets constructed in the FY 2022-23 are as under:

- Financial assistance of Rs. 5.03 Lakhs provided for construction of toilets in village Brow (near Brow Chowk/Junction Rampur Road), Gram Panchayat Brow, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P).
- SJVN Foundation has constructed 4 No. Toilet blocks, 2 No. at Govt. High School Koyal & 2 No. at Govt. Primary School Koyal, Gram Panchayat Gadej, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P) at the





cost of Rs. 5.48 Lakhs.



- c. A community toilet at Village Kathanda, Gram Panchayat Bahwa, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P) has been constructed at the cost of Rs. 2.74 Lakhs.
- d. Under Swachh Bharat Mission, a toilet has been constructed at Mahila Mandal Bhawan Gram Panchayat Kushwa, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P), Chatti, Gram Panchayat Jagatkhana, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P) and Govt. Senior Secondary School, Duttanagar Gram Panchayat Duttanagar, Tehsil Rampur, Distt. Shimla (H.P) at the cost of Rs. 17.88 Lakhs.
- e. Toilet constructed at the cost of Rs. 3.09 Lakhs in Govt. Senior Secondary School Kasholi, Gram Panchayat Bari, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P).
- f. Community toilet constructed Near Pokhu Temple, in village Naitwar at the cost of Rs. 5.45 Lakhs through NMHEP, Mori.
- g. Financial assistance of Rs. 5.30 Lakhs provided for construction of toilets at

Kaali Mata mandir at GP Gopalpur, Tehsil Rampur and Bodh Mandir at GP Nichar, tehsil Nichar Distt. Kinnaur (HP)

- h. Financial assistance of Rs. 2.38 Lakhs provided for construction of Toilet Block in Shri Dutt Maharaj Devta Mandir Basahra, GP Gopalpur, Tehsil - Rampur, Distt. Shimla (H.P).
- i. Financial assistance of Rs. 6.29 Lakhs provided for construction of toilet block at GPS Gasoh & GPS- Jeori, Tehsil- Rampur Bsr, Distt- Shimla (HP)

2. Education and Skill Development

SJVN firmly believes that development of the nation depends primarily upon the education and skill sets of its human assets and considering the demand of skill in different sector, SJVN has been playing a key role in the upskilling of youth by providing them with necessary behavioural and technical skills. The efforts are not only limited to extending the scholarship to meritorious students but it has been extended beyond by strengthening the educational institution in every way possible.

Going by the philosophy of investing in the education as well as skill development of youths will provide larger dividends in the near future, SJVN has continued implementing a number of education and skill development programs in its operational areas to support the nation in the FY 2022-23. The various schemes being run by SJVN are as under:

Nomination of Project affected youths in Govt. ITI :

SJVN Foundation has been nominating local youths to enhance their technical skills to make them capable for employment. Under the scheme, SJVN provides monthly stipend of Rs. 2000/- to each candidate apart from nominating the course fee of the trainee. Therefore, in FY, 2022-23, a total of 31 candidates have been nominated in Govt. ITIs from LHEP, SDHEP, DSHEP & JTPHEP. The details are as follows:

SJVN Foundation entered into a MOU with the Director, Technical Education, Sundernagar on 27.10.2016 for developing and strengthening the infrastructural facilities in six ITIs by providing financial assistance of Rs. 100.00 Lakhs each in order to develop them as "Centres of Excellence" in Himachal Pradesh. The Institute Management Committees (IMCs) in respect of the 6 ITIs were notified by the Government of Himachal Pradesh. The details of funds provided by the SJVN Foundation as on 31.03.2023 are as under:

Due to unavailability of land for development of ITI, Nainidhar, the ITI authorities were not able to utilize the amount, hence, an amount of Rs. 137.49 Lakhs was refunded to SJVN. The refunded amount will be utilized in the CSR and Sustainability budget 2023-24 for other CSR activities. However, in respect of other ITI's the concerned projects are expediting the utilization of the funds.

Deen Dayal Upadhyay SJVN Krishi Kaushal Yojana

Agriculture is one of the major economic sectors in India which is contributing in the GDP of India and is among the world's top five producers, however due to lack of technical and modern agriculture techniques, the Indian farmers are not able to

produce good quality crops and earn more. SJVN has been very much well versed with the need of skilling the farmer with a view to double their income as envisaged by GoI. Hence, SJVN has been providing the farmers a platform to learn new techniques of scientific farming through skill training in the areas of new agricultural technology and innovative scientific methods of cultivation. By equipping farmers with updated knowledge and techniques, the aim is to enhance their farming practices and productivity, consequently leading to increased income.

Accordingly, SJVN has collaborated with CSK UHF Palampur and University of Horticulture and Forestry Nauni, Solan for providing skill development training to the





farmers of project affected areas and other farmer of Himachal Pradesh. An MoU was executed with CSK University Palampur on 26.10.2021 for imparting 06 days residential skill training to 1000 farmers through 40 camps. Out of the 40 camps, 30 camps have been completed in FY 2021-22 and remaining 10 camps are organized in FY 2022-23.

In addition, 06 one-day farmer camps for 1500 farmers were planned through University of Horticulture and Forestry, Nauni in FY 2021-22 but only 05 camps were completed in the FY 2021-22. The remaining 01 camp was to be conducted in the project affected areas of Chenab Projects but due to large area and small number of populations in the area it was decided to conduct 02 program for the farmers. The details of programs completed in the FY 2022-23 are as under:

As on 31.03.2023, 178 students out of 200 have completed the skill development training program. The training of balance 22 students in GWS and electrician trade at Dhaulana (UP) and Ranchi (JH) respectively is under progress. Also, 154 students out of 178 students have been provided with placement opportunities. The total cost of the

project is Rs. 106.23 Lakhs and so far, an amount of Rs. 92.76 Lakhs has been released in favour of CIDC in 02 instalments. The balance amount will be released after the completion of the skill development programs.

Schools Munderi, Kannur, Kerala, SJVN Foundation has executed MOU on 16.11.2019 with District Panchayat, Kannur for installation of Grid connected Solar Power Plant in the school with financial implication of Rs.66.85 Lakhs. The work is completed and full amount of Rs.66.85 Lakhs has been released to District Panchayat Kannur.



Implementation of horticulture-based livelihood project in four Gram Panchayats of Distt. Kinnaur, HP under NJHPS project affected area

A tripartite MOU was executed by SJVN Foundation, NABARD & HARP on

07.07.2020 for providing financial support on sharing basis with NABARD for implementation of a Horticulture based livelihood project (integrated Tribal Development Projects) in the four Gram Panchayats of Distt. Kinnaur, viz. Bari, Ponda, Sungra and Taranda situated on the left banks of River Satluj, covered under the NJHPS affected areas. Out of the total cost of Rs. 537.71 Lakhs SJVN is providing Rs. 222.33 Lakhs (i.e 41%) for the implementation of a Horticulture based livelihood project in Bari and Tranda Panchayat of Nichar Block, Kinnaur. The basic four activities carried out in the aforesaid project are as under:

- i. Orchard establishment on farmers' field,
- ii. Water Resource Development,
- iii. Livelihood activities for landless families, and
- iv. Training and capacity building.

The duration of the project is five years and is being monitored by NJHPS, Jhakri. Out of the sanctioned amount of Rs. 222.33 Lakhs an amount of Rs. 172.98 Lakhs has been released till date to the agency. The execution of the project is under process.





Construction of school building in Temporary colony at NJHPS Nathpa

Nathpa is village located in the project affected area of Nathpa Jhakri HPS. The village is located at very far-flung location and there is scarcity of schools for quality primary education. Hence, keeping in view the need of a school, SJVN Foundation has constructed a school building in temporary colony of NJHPS, Nathpa for the local people of project affected areas at a cost of Rs. 402.57 Lakhs. This initiative will be benefitting more than 1000 people residing in the vicinity of the project area.



Construction of School Building of Govt. Primary School Puje Block Nichar Tehsil Nichar Distt. Kinnaur (HP).

The Govt. Primary School, Puje comes under the project affected area of Tehsil Nichar in District Kinnaur. The school was in a dilapidated condition, hence, SJVN Foundation through Nathpa Jhakri HPS on the request of the school management has renovated and reconstructed the school at a cost of Rs. 20.58 Lakhs. The work is completed and school is operational.

Other activities under Education & Skill Development

SJVN provided financial assistance for improving infrastructure in various schools of project affected areas with a view to promote education and skill development amongst the students. The details are as under:

- a. Repair work of Govt. Primary School Nigulsari, Tehsil Nichar Distt Kinnaur at the cost of Rs. 5.30 Lakhs.



- b. Financial support of Rs. 2.15 Lakhs for Mid-day meal Kitchen renovation at GHS Vikas Nagar, Shimla.





c. Financial support of Rs. 7.30 Lakhs provided chain link fencing, painting, and repair work of Govt. Sr. Sec. School Jhakri Tehsil Rampur Bsr. Distt. Shimla (HP).



d. Financial Support of Rs. 5.16 Lakhs for repair & replacement of Kota Stone flooring on terrace, sanitary fittings P/F grating on U-shape drain and other misc. works in DAV SJVN Public School building at Rampur HPS colony at Duttnagar Tehsil Rampur District Shimla.

e. Financial assistance of Rs. 5.30 Lakhs for providing computer printer and books for library established in project Affected Panchayats of RHPS.

ground water recharging does not happen due to water runoff. Further, in the hilly areas there are natural sources of water such as Bavdi, Piyau etc which often gets clogged due to landslides etc. To tackle this issue, SJVN over the years has supported villagers in the vicinity of its project areas in building tanks and rehabilitation of existing water bodies like springs, ponds etc. During the FY 2022-23, 03 water bodies were undertaken for restoration as detailed hereunder:

In FY 2022-23, Rampur HPS has extended financial support of Rs. 2.90 Lakhs on repairing the water Bawari at Village Chillage, GP Bakhan, Nirmand, Distt. Kullu in H.P.

Renovation of community sarovar / pond at Village Sarog, Tehsil Theog, Distt. Shimla, H.P

SJVN under the swachhta initiative has renovated a dilapidated pond at village Sarog, tehsil Theog District Shimla which is

servicing a large number of local people. The work was executed and monitored by Rampur HPS. The construction and maintenance of the pond has benefitted thousands of local people which are dependent on the pond for day-to-day





domestic water needs. The pond has been renovated at the cost of Rs. 14.81 Lakhs which includes cleaning of water, trenches, tiles, fencing etc.



Development of bio-diversity park at Shanan, Shimla

SJVN Foundation under its CSR initiatives has constructed a bio-diversity park in the vicinity of the company's Corporate Headquarters at Shanan in Shimla, the park is offering facilities such as game area for the local children, open air gym and a model of 1.3 Kw hydroelectric power station. For development of this park, a tripartite agreement was entered between SJVN Limited, M/s Magnus Infra tech Pvt Ltd. and SJVN Foundation on 29th December 2021 for development of this bio-diversity park. Initially, the total cost for construction of this bio-diversity park was estimated to be Rs.

294.44 Lakhs. However, the actual expenditure incurred on the construction of the bio diversity park was Rs. 208.54 Lakhs. The full amount is released and the project stands completed.



Installation of solar street lights

The provision of street lights has become very popular public infrastructure that facilitates smooth navigation in the absence of natural light. In order to contain the ill effects of climate change, the technology is switching over to energy-efficient LED solar lights. These solar lights absorb solar energy when the sun is out and convert it into usable electrical energy which lights the LED in the night. The project areas of SJVN are located in very far locations where there is absence of proper lighting during the night, making areas prone to mishaps. Accordingly, based on the demands of the local bodies, SJVN has been providing financial support for installation of solar lights in and around the areas of its presence. The lights are being installed through various agencies such as Energy Efficiency and Service Limited (EESL), HIMURJA etc.

a. Installation of Lights through EESL

With a view to promote clean and green environment, an agreement was signed between SJVN Foundation and (EESL) on 18.12.2017 for installation of 5750 solar street light in the 23 constituencies of Shimla and Mandi districts of Himachal Pradesh. The total cost of the project was Rs. 1111.74 Lakhs. The project got delayed due to COVID-19 and other unforeseen reasons. During the FY 2022-23, the same has been completed and full amount has been released.

In addition, an MOA was signed on 28.10.21 with EESL for installation of additional 700 lights in the project area of SJVN in H.P and Shimla. The project stands completed and the total expenditure of Rs. 137.84 Lakhs stands released.



b. Installation of Solar lights in Seraj constituency

Seraj is legislative constituency located in far-flung areas of Mandi District in H.P. This area is hilly as well as backward which requires certain developmental activities. The local legislative bodies of the area requested SJVN for financial assistance to install 2340 Solar Lights in the 78 Gram Panchayats of three blocks namely, Seraj (33 GPs), Balichowki (29 GPs) and Gohar (16 GPs) of Seraj Constituency, Distt. Mandi (HP). Accordingly, SJVN Foundation sanctioned Rs. 336.59 Lakhs for installation of 2340 solar lights in 73 Gram panchayats of Seraj Constituency. The 2340 lights have been installed through HIMURJA and the work stands complete.

Installation of Solar lights through various agencies

Based on the demands of local people, on the request of local village panchayats, local legislators etc, SJVN has provided financial assistance for supply and installation of solar lights in and around its project areas/offices. The installation of these solar lights has been benefitting the local public as well as raising the overall well-being of the villages like easy movement during evening hours, reduce snake bite incidents, improved sense of security among women and children etc. The details of lights installed are as under:

Financial support for lift water supply scheme to project affected areas in Dist. Kullu

The village Nither, Dehra and Annas, are situated in Nirmand block of Distt. Kullu which are project affected villages of Luhri HEP-1. In order to ensure continuous supply of water, an MoU was signed on dated 28.03.2022 between SJVN and Jal Shakti Vibhag, GoHP, for construction of Lift

Water Supply Scheme to village Nither, Dehra and Annas, in Nirmand Block, Distt. Kullu from Kurpan Khad. The total estimated cost of the project is Rs. 1977.00 Lakhs out of which SJVN Foundation is contributing an amount of Rs. 800.00 Lakhs for the said scheme as a part of SJVNs social commitment towards the project affected panchayats and the work is being monitored by Luhri HEP-1. As on 31.03.2023, an





amount of Rs. 500.00 Lakhs has been released and the work is under progress



Financial support for Lift irrigation Scheme to village Nirath, Distt. Shimla

Panchayat Nirath, Tehsil Rampur Bushahr District, Shimla is one of the affected panchayats of Luhri HEP Stage-1. As a part of social commitment of SJVN, an MoU between SJVN and Jal Shakti Vibhag (JSV) was signed in the presence of MP, Mandi at Rampur on 07.03.2023 for construction of lift irrigation scheme from Malchada Khad to all the villages of Panchayat Nirath, Tehsil Rampur Bushehr, District Shimla. For the scheme an amount of Rs. 1393.94 Lakhs has been sanctioned and work is being monitored by Luhri HEP-1. So far, first instalment of Rs. 200.00 Lakhs has been deposited to JSV, Rampur for Irrigation and the work is under progress.



Awareness on Energy Conservation- State Level School Painting Competition



Like previous year, the State Level Painting Competition initiated by BEE, Ministry of Power was organized under National Awareness Campaign on 14.11.2022 at SJVN Corporate Head Quarter, Shimla. SJVN is the nodal agency for organizing the same in Himachal Pradesh.

For the FY 2022-23, the Selected 110 students out of total 1869 students of 436 schools from various districts of Himachal Pradesh participated in the painting competition. For the state level painting competition, the participants were divided in two categories i.e Category A (5th to 7th Class) and Category B (8th to 10th Class). The common themes for both the categories was ‘Theme-1: We are Pro-Planet People and Theme-2: Circular Economy – Reuse, Reduce and Recycle.’

In addition, as an appreciation for their efforts, all the participants were given mementoes and LED Bulbs to further the cause of energy conservation awareness.

Support for Construction of Gau Sadan in and around project areas

As part of sustainability practices, SJVN Foundation is also providing financial support for construction of gau sadan, fodder for cows, other animals based on the request of local communities. Few CSR initiatives of supporting the gau sadans are as under:

- Dhaulta Sidh HEP provided financial support of Rs. 1.50 Lakhs for purchase of wheat straw to Cow Sanctuary, Kheri, Sujampur, Distt. Hamirpur (HP).
- Financial assistance of Rs. 2.88 Lakhs provided for running of Shinger Gau Sadan at Averi, Gram Panchayat Bhawa, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu.
- Financial assistance of Rs. 2.57 Lakhs for providing equipment such as cow dung pot machine, cow dung diya machine & cow dung dhoopbatti machine to Shri Hari Krishna Gauseva evm Paryavaran Sanrakshan Trust Rampur Bushahr, Tehsil Rampur, Distt. Shimla H.P.
- Financial assistance of Rs. 5.00 Lakhs provided to Shri Geeta Mahima Gaushala at Badrash, Tehsil Rampur, Distt. Shimla for purchasing animal fodder.

4. Empowerment of Vulnerable sections of society

Vulnerable sections of society encompass a wide range of marginalized groups, including but not limited to women, children, the elderly, persons with disabilities, ethnic and religious minorities, refugees, and the economically disadvantaged. These groups often face social, economic, and political barriers that restrict their access to resources, opportunities, and decision-making processes. Empowering these sections is essential to ensure inclusivity, equal rights, and social progress. SJVN is implementing a number of initiatives for their upliftment and betterment. The various initiatives undertaken by SJVN are as under :

Women and Child Development Scheme

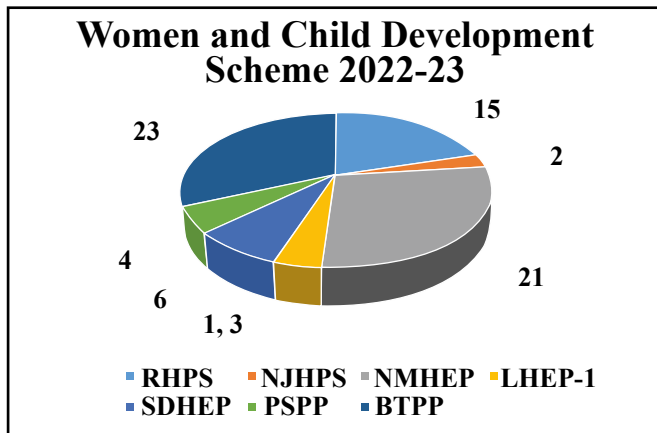
SJVN started "SJVN Silver Jubilee Women and Child Development scheme" in 2012-13 under which the Below Poverty Line (BPL) women residing in Project Areas of SJVN are eligible for a financial benefit of Rs.10,000/- in two instalments of Rs.5,000/- each during ante natal and post-natal period to enable healthy nourishment to the newborn child.





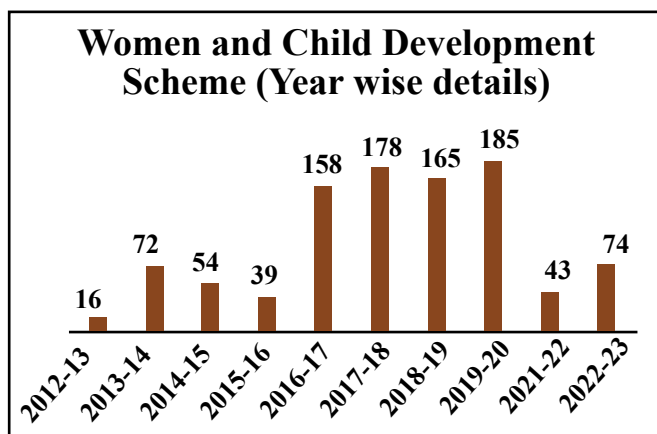
Besides direct financial benefit, a gift pack worth Rs.1000/- consisting of nutritional food items, soaps and other hygiene related items needed for the care of the newborn are also given to BPL women. In FY 2022-23, a total of 74 women were benefitted from this scheme.

COVID-19, the centre was running short of funds and hence requested SJVN for support. Accordingly, based on the committee report the financial assistance of Rs. 24.68 Lakhs (Rs. 13.88 Lakhs for vehicle and Rs. 10.80 Lakhs for skill training) was sanctioned to Udaan Sanstha in the FY 21-22.



Cumulatively, a total of 984 women have been benefitted till 31.03.2023 as detailed below :

As on 31.03.2023, an amount of Rs. 23.03 Lakhs stands released to the agency, out of which Rs. 19.59 Lakhs has been released in the FY 22-23 against the skill training and the purchase of vehicle. Further, the procurement of vehicle (Tata Winger) is under process and final instalment against skill training will be released after submission of UC.



Financial support for School-cum-Home for special children at Dhalli, Shimla

Skill development project for intellectual and overall development of Special children

A school for home for speech, hearing and visually impaired children is being run by Department of Social Justice and Empowerment at Dhalli, Shimla H.P. The school is old and houses a limited number of students only. The condition of the old school building was very dilapidated, hence, SJVN Foundation on the request of Department of Social Justice and Empowerment has entered into an MOU on

Udaan Sanastha, New Shimla has approached SJVN Foundation for providing the financial assistance for purchase of vehicle for transportation and skill development of special children enrolled in their day care centre. Due to the ill effects of





21.03.2017 with Director, Directorate for the Empowerment of Schedule Castes, Other Backward Classes, Minorities and Specially Abled (ESOMSA), GoHP to provide financial assistance of Rs. 827.99 Lakhs for construction of school-cum-home for the speech, hearing, and visually impaired children.

The work is being executed through HPPWD and an amount of Rs. 518.00 Lakhs has already been released to the agency. The structural work, truss work has been completed and further finishing work of the building is under process.



Construction of Senior Citizen Home at Palampur H.P

SJVN Foundation has provided financial support of Rs. 300.00 Lakhs for the construction of a Senior Citizen Home “Vishranti” at Vivekananda Medical Institute Palampur, District Kangra H.P which is catering to the mental and physical health of the oldage people. The work is being monitored through Dhaula Sidh HEP, Hamirpur

The Vishranti Bhawan is having a capacity of catering to the stay of 100 senior citizens and will be equipped with all the facilities

like sick room, medical check-up, library, audio-visual room, mess and security etc. and the assistance of medical and health services for the Senior Citizens living in Vishranti Bhawan will easily be taken care of by Vivekananda Medical Institute and Centre for Naturopathy. As on 31.03.2023, an amount of Rs. 200.00 Lakhs stands released to VMRT out of which Rs. 150.00 Lakhs has been released in FY 22-23. The work is nearing completion.



Financial support to ‘Hingiri Kalyan Ashram’ for construction of Hostel for Tribal Children’

SJVN Foundation has provided the financial support of Rs.126.71 Lakhs to Hingiri Kalyan Ashram for construction and finishing of 1st floor slab of new boys hostel block for tribal students in Shimla. As on date, full amount of Rs. 126.71 Lakhs has been released and the finishing work of the building is completed. The building has been inaugurated and houses about 50 tribal students.





Financial support for facilitating the studies of students in special children school at Dhalli, Shimla

SJVN Foundation has provided financial support to HP State Council for Child Welfare, Craig, Shimla for facilitating the studies of the special children at the school cum home for speech, hearing, and visually impaired children at Dhalli, District Shimla since. In FY 2022-23, 131 hearing and visually impaired students are studying in the school. SJVN having a positive impact towards the promotion of talent of the students and at the same time this is encouraging them to achieve higher levels in life ahead. In the FY 2022-23 an amount of Rs. 11.02 Lakhs was sanctioned to HP State Council for Child Welfare, Craig, Shimla.



Skill Development training to local youth and young women of slum areas

Often the youth of slum area are very talented but neglected due to lack of proper guidance and resources to showcase their talent. Hence with a view to enhance the skill & ability of local youth and young women at slum so as to increase their employability, SJVN foundation has been providing financial support to Youth Resource Centre

(YRC) run by AAROCHAN, New Delhi for providing skill development training in employable trades to them. In the FY 2021-22, training for 180 local youth and young women of slum area in trades such as cutting and tailoring, computer literacy etc was started through AAROCHAN, New Delhi which continued till FY 2022-23. All the training programs have been completed and full amount of Rs. 10.00 Lakhs stands released out of which final instalment of Rs. 3.00 Lakhs released in FY 20223. Since 2018, 540 local youth from slum areas have been provided with skill development training in employable trades.

5. Infrastructural Development and Community Asset Creation

Infrastructure, encompassing various physical and social systems, forms the backbone of economies, societies and communities. Within the realm of CSR, infrastructure development emerges as a crucial aspect, embodying the commitment of corporations to contribute meaningfully to the communities they operate in. As companies recognize the interdependence between their success and the well-being of localities, they embrace the responsibility to invest in infrastructure projects that enhance

the quality of life, foster sustainable development, and create lasting positive impacts. SJVN Foundation under its CSR vertical, "Infrastructural and Community Development," focuses on promoting infrastructural development activities such as constructing community halls, path ways, school buildings, hospitals, roads, bridges, public toilets, bus stands, public parks, playgrounds etc.

SJVN Foundation adopts a participative approach in the selection and execution of these activities which involves various stakeholders such as village development area committees, school management committees, panchayats and community-based organizations. This inclusive approach not only brings transparency & diverse perspectives to the table but also fosters a sense of community engagement and empowerment.

Financial assistance for construction of ambulance road from main road to village, Kwalag in Gram Panchayat, Distt. Shimla

Pradhan, Gram Panchayat Pujarali has requested for financial assistance for construction of ambulance road from Junga to village Kawalang in Gram Panchayat Pujarali, Distt. Shimla. The upper and lower sides of the road near junction point of Junga Road was affecting the vegetation and road conditions adversely. Therefore, based on the committee recommendation, SJVN has sanctioned Rs.10.00 Lakhs for above said work. Accordingly, two instalments of Rs.8.00 Lakhs stand released till date, the construction work is completed and UC has been received. Further, on the recommendation of the committee the sanctioned amount has been restricted up to Rs.8.00 Lakhs because remaining works have completed by other agency.



Financial assistance for construction of four New toilets for Girls at Govt. Sr. Secondary School Sarot Distt. Shimla.

Principal, Govt. Sr. Secondary School Sarot, District Shimla, has requested for construction of girls toilets in the school. The absence of basic toilet facilities in the

school poses a significant challenge for the girl students. Hence, realizing the urgency, the need for improved sanitation infrastructure and importance of addressing this issue, the SJVN Foundation has sanctioned financial support of Rs.5.35 Lakhs for construction of 04 girl toilets in the school. Subsequently, the work was successfully completed by the school.



Financial assistance for constructing Hostel cum meditation centre at Ringchen Zangpo, Endowment Society, Ponda Distt. Kinnaur.

Ringchen Zangpo, Endowment Society Ponda (HP) has requested SJVN for providing the financial assistance for construction of Hostel cum meditation centre in the campus. The society is engaged in spiritual and philosophy education, preservation of the traditional medicines and spiritual healing services, free education including boarding and lodging, meditation and yoga teaching for the devotees of Buddhist religion. The students from Ponda, Nichar, Bari, Ribba, Thangi, Rispa, Jangi etc. are undergoing education and almost all the villages are PAA of the NJHPS.





Accordingly, the financial assistance of Rs.76.65 Lakhs was agreed by NJHPS on the basis of committee recommendation which will benefit approximately 450 students/ persons. As on 31.03.23, an amount of Rs.68.99 Lakhs has been released to the society and the work is under progress.

Construction of Community centre in Village Tikri, Gram Panchayat Kharga, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu (H.P.)



The Project affected Village Tikri, Panchayat Kharga of RHPs is situated in remote and hilly area. The common hall for organizing various event was not available in this area. Therefore, on the request of the Panchayat, Rampur HPS has constructed one Community Centre with electrification in this village for facilitating to organize public meetings, cultural events & to help poor people for organizing the events at minimal charges. Approx. 500 people are

getting benefitted from this activity every year. Total budget sanctioned for this activity is Rs.10.40 Lakhs out of which Rs.7.28 Lakhs has been released.

Construction of Rain Shelter along with sitting arrangement near Moksh Dham in village Nirsu, Panchayat Duttnagar, Tehsil Rampur, Distt. Shimla.

Due to lack of the facility of rain shelter near Moksh Dham in village Nirsu, locals were facing problems while performing the last rites esp. in rainy and summer season and hence, the Panchayat requested SJVN for construction of the rain shelter along with the sitting arrangement. Therefore, SJVN has sanctioned financial assistance of Rs.12.48 Lakhs for construction of rain shelter with seating arrangement of 50-60 persons on the left bank of river Satluj. This rain shelter will benefit 400-500 persons of village Nirsu.



Financial support for soling, concerting and construction of R/wall on ambulance road in GP Malyana, Shimla.

GP Malyana has requested for providing financial assistance for construction of retaining wall and ambulance road in Gram





Panchayat Malyana. Accordingly based on the committee recommendation SJVN Foundation has sanctioned the financial assistance of Rs.15.85 Lakhs for this project. Further, Rs.12.68 Lakhs in two installments stands released and work is in progress and UC is awaited.



Financial assistance for various developmental works in Project affected area of NMHEP:

By actively engaging in the promotion of local culture, heritage, and sports, we aim to preserve traditions, empower communities, and foster a sense of pride and unity.

Financial Support for construction and re- development of Sh. Badrinath Dham (Sheshnetra lake) town as spiritual Smart Hill Town.



The GoUK have initiated the process of construction and redevelopment of Sh.





Badrinath Dham as Spiritual Smart Hill Town in order to achieve the grand vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister of India. The activities will add to comfort and safety of millions of pilgrims visiting the shrine and will enrich the lives with unforgettable religious and spiritual experience. Accordingly, MOU between SJVN Foundation and Shri Kedarnath Utthan Charitable Trust was signed on 16 March 2021 for construction and redevelopment of Sheshnetra Lake at Badrinath Dham amounting to Rs.1199.00 Lakhs. So far an amount of Rs. 466.28 Lakhs has been released in two instalments. A joint visit was conducted by officials from SJVN, SKUCT and PWD, UK to monitor the progress of work. The work is under progress and so far 57% works have been completed.

Development of Kedarnath Town (Pilgrim accommodation block) through Shri Kedarnath Utthan Charitable Trust (SKUCT).



The Govt. of Uttarakhand (GoUK) has embarked on mission to reconstruct and redevelop the Kedarnath and Badrinath towns as smart Spiritual Hill City as per the vision of the Hon'ble Prime Minister. Hence, GoUK is implementing the project through its Trust "Shri Kedar Nath Utthan

Charitable Trust" (SKUT). Accordingly, MOU between SJVN Foundation and Shri Kedarnath Utthan Charitable Trust was signed on 14th October 2022 for construction of Pilgrim Accommodation Blocks amounting to Rs.10.00 Cr. As per the MOU, the 1st instalment of 10% amount Rs.1.00 Cr. has been released after receipt of final DPR from SKUCT. The project is being monitored by Devsari HEP.

Financial support for finishing work of new Yatri Sadan (Tourist Shelter Home) and construction of attic floor of Yatri Sadan at Churdhar Distt. Shimla.



SJVN Foundation has extended the financial assistance of Rs.72.12 Lakhs to Chureshwar Sewa Samiti for construction of Yatri Sadan and an amount of Rs.57.68 Lakhs has been released to the agency. In the FY 2022-23, the agency has requested for carrying out the





additional work in the premises and approve the cost escalation with regard to final instalment. Hence, based on the committee visit and recommendation additional amount of Rs.21.50 Lakhs and cost escalation of Rs.15.00 Lakhs was approved. Therefore, the total revised financial assistance is Rs.108.62 Lakhs. So far Rs.104.32 Lakhs has been released and balance will be released after completion of work.

Financial assistance for various construction works in Mahavir Temple, Khushala, Shoghi Distt. Shimla.

The Mahavir Mandir Kushala is a renowned temple situated in Shoghi, Distt. Shimla. It attracts a large number of devotees throughout the year, especially during occasions like Hanuman Jayanti and Radha Ashtami, however, few development works are required to be undertaken for which the Mandir committee has approached the SJVN Foundation, requesting:



1. Financial assistance of Rs.25.61 Lakhs for construction of retaining walls alongside the temple premises and langar hall- Recognizing the importance of facilitating pilgrims visiting Mahavir Mandir Khushala Distt. Shimla, SJVN Foundation has extended financial assistance of Rs.25.61 Lakhs. The work

has been completed & the entire sanctioned amount released. The work was executed through SDHEP.



2. Construction of retaining wall at Nallah adjacent to Temple and flooring work in the temple premises: SJVN Foundation has extended financial assistance of Rs.17.00 Lakhs for the protection from Nallah by constructing the retaining wall and renovated the damaged flooring of the temple. 1st installment of Rs.6.80 Lakhs has been released and the work is under progress.

Financial assistance for rejuvenation/ renovation of Kothi Structure of Durga Mata Madir Tranda, GP Tranda Tehsil Nichar Distt. Kinnaur (HP) was provided amounting to Rs.33,15,980/-. The fund was

provided only for base structure excluding the cost of brass sheet plate roofing. The work of roofing will be taken-up by the Mandir committee.



Development of four Cultural Heritage Sites of Himachal Pradesh

Fort through Nathpa Jhakri HPS and an amount of Rs.50.00 Lakhs stands released to Piri Killa Nirman Prabandhan Committee Sapni.

b. Development of Parshuram Temple Complex, Nirmand

SJVN Foundation has extended financial support of Rs.29.12 Lakhs for the renovation of Shri Parshuram Temple complex, VPO Nirmand, Tehsil Nirmand, Distt. Kullu through Rampur HPS. As on 31.03.2023, an amount of Rs. 20.38 Lakhs stands released out of which Rs. 11.65 Lakhs released in FY 2022-23. The work is nearing completion.

Construction of Shri Kali Temple at Deonder and railing around temple

A proposal for construction of the temple complex and railing work around the temple premises by Secretary, Shri Kali Temple, Deondar, Tehsil Chopal, District Shimla was submitted to SJVN and after due diligence SJVN Foundation extended financial assistance of Rs.50.54 Lakhs to Mandir committee. The construction/renovation work has been completed and balance payment of Rs.10.00 Lakhs released to the agency in FY 2022-23.



Financial Support for various works related to renovation of Sidh Baba Balak Nath Temple, Jakhu

Baba Balak Nath temple, Jakhu is very old temple located at Jakhu Hill Shimla. The existing structure was constructed with the own funds of the Mandir Sabha. However, due to lack of funds only basic structure work was constructed and other finishing works were left unattended. Hence, the Mandir Sabha requested SJVN for the renovation of langar hall/bhawan with store, finishing of temple stairs and temple main entrance gate etc. The total estimated cost of the project was Rs.15,90,000/-. Based on the committee report, SJVN Foundation agreed to provide financial assistance limited to 80% of the total estimated cost i.e., Rs. 12,72,000/-. In the FY 2022-23, 1st instalment of Rs. 5.09 Lakhs has been released and the work is under progress.





Financial assistance for construction of ground of Sh. Garshuji Narayan Mandir at village Kachrang GP Nathpa Tehsil Nichar Distt. Kinnaur (HP).

Sh, Garshuji Narayan Mandir is situated at village Kachrang GP Nathpa Tehsil Nichar Distt. Kinnaur (HP). The village Kachrang is small village in the far flung area of GP Nathpa. The Mandir committee requested NJHPS for providing the financial assistance of Rs.21.95 Lakhs for construction of ground so as to carry out the various religious and cultural activities. Therefore, after all the codal formalities, SJVN sanctioned the requested financial assistance. The work has been completed and sanctioned amount released. Approx. 250 beneficiaries have been benefitted with the construction of this ground.

Financial support for integrated development of Kevadia, Gujarat as integral part of ‘Statue of Unity’

SJVN Foundation has extended financial support of Rs.5.00 Cr. to Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Rashtriya Ekta Trust (SVPRET) for the construction of 400 houses in Adarsh Gram at village Gora Near Kevadia Colony as

integral part of Statue of Unity. So far an amount of Rs.4.90 Cr. has been released to SVPRET out of which Rs.2.90 Cr. has been released in FY 2022-23. The balance amount will be released after receipt of UC.

7. Assistance during Natural Disaster

Natural disasters possess harmful and negative impact on the society following any natural hazard. These disasters sometimes cause huge loss in terms of men, material, and money. A huge support is required during the disasters for rehabilitation of the victims. SJVN has always been in the forefront in providing timely relief assistance to the victims of natural calamities by extending relief materials & infrastructural support directly to the victims or through contributing to the Government funds such as State Disaster Management Funds, PM CARES Fund etc.

Financial assistance to Baru Sahib Sirmour HP for restoration of infrastructure damaged due to intense cloud burst.

The Kalgidhar Trust, Baru Sahib is a philanthropic non-profit organization dedicated to providing quality-based education. The society runs 129 rural schools, 2 universities, a women's educational skill development center, a 120-bed charitable hospital in the remote area of Distt. Sirmour, H.P., and 2 rehabilitation centres against drug addiction.

During the FY 2022-23, unfortunately the campus of Akal Academy Baru Sahib village Mangarh Distt. Sirmour H.P was severely





damaged/affected by a cloud burst. About 2000 students study in the Akal Academy and most of the infrastructure such as library, academic block etc. was damaged due to the sudden flow of huge water in the academy. In light of this calamity, the Kalgidhar Trust, Baru Sahib requested financial support for repairing and restoring the infrastructure of the academy. Recognizing the need, SJVN Foundation extended Rs. 50.00 Lakhs for various development/ restoration works within the main school complex. The necessary repairs and restoration have been completed and the facilities have been restored at the Akal Academy campus.



Support to the victims of heavy landslide at Paingadh village, Tharali, Uttarkhand

Due to heavy landslide in Paingadh village of Tharali, in Chamoli District of Uttarakhand, the 43 families lost their

houses. The village is located in the project affected area of Devsari HEP, hence, the local administration requested SJVN Foundation to provide tarpaulin for making temporary shelters to the victims of the landslide. Accordingly, sensing the urgency of the situation, SJVN foundation immediately forayed in to action and provided tarpaulin at the expenditure of Rs. 4.33 Lakhs to the local administration through Devsari HEP, Tharali.



8. Development works in Aspirational District, Chamba, H.P

Under the programme ‘Transformation of Aspirational Districts’ launched by the GoI, SJVN has been allocated District Chamba in H.P for quickly and effectively transforming the district through developmental works. SJVN has been taking up various developmental projects in District Chamba based on annual common CSR theme in association with the District Administration. The projects are being monitored jointly by SJVN and representatives of Dy. Commissioner, Chamba. The various initiatives under taken during FY 2022-23 on the Annual CSR theme 2022-23 i.e. “Health and Nutrition” are as under:

Distribution of Nutrition & Health Kits

The annual theme for FY 2019-20 was "School Education, Healthcare & Nutrition". Accordingly, SJVN has extended financial support to District Administration, Chamba for infrastructure development in areas of School Education, Healthcare & Nutrition in the district. One of the programmes for which SJVN Foundation provided financial support was to distribute nutrition and health kits amongst 10,000 pregnant/lactating mothers during pregnancy & up to lactation period for betterment of pregnant women during pregnancy & post pregnancy. The estimated total cost of the project was Rs. 100.70 Lakhs. The support has extended to DC, Chamba for the activity started in the FY 2019-20 and continued till FY 2022-23. As on 31.03.2023, an amount of Rs. 100.70 Lakhs stands released to District Administration Chamba, out of which Rs. 33.70 Lakhs has been released in FY 2022-23.



Operation of Mobile Medical Unit, Kihar and CBNAAT Mobile Van

SJVN Foundation has provided financial support for procurement of various medical items to DC Chamba vide letter dated

30.12.2019 and 16.03.2020 which includes Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) at the cost of Rs. 11.00 Lakhs and CBNAAT Mobile Van at the cost of Rs. 42.97 Lakhs. During the FY 2022-23, DC Chamba requested funds for the operation of MMU and CBNAAT Machine. Accordingly, based on the report of committee constituted as well as benefit of the initiatives on the National Health Mission, SJVN Foundation sanctioned on Rs. 18 Lakhs for operation of MMU which is operational at Kihar Block of Distt. Chamba for one year and Rs. 60 Lakhs for operation of CBNAAT Mobile Van for two years. As on 31.03.2023, an amount of Rs. 9 Lakhs and Rs. 15 Lakhs have been released as first instalment for operation of MMU running at Kihar Block Chamba and CBNAAT Machine respectively.





New proposal on the annual CSR theme FY 22-23 “Health and Nutrition”

Under the Aspirational District Scheme in FY 2022-23, DC Chamba requested SJVN to provide financial assistance for setting up two e-classrooms in Govt. Medical College Chamba and procurement of items for Paediatrics and Dental Department for Pt. JLNGMC & Hospital Chamba, H.P.

Accordingly, based on the report of committee constituted at DSHEP, Hamirpur, SJVN Foundation agreed to provide financial assistance of Rs. 78.00 Lakhs for procurement of dental equipments as well as infra work at Pt. JLNGMC & Hospital Chamba and Rs. 35.99 Lakhs for setting up of two E-Classrooms in Govt. Medical College Chamba.

SUCCESS STORIES

1. MMU Nathpa Jhakri-1: Service of Mobile Medical Unit– A Boon for Patients

Smt. Satya Devi is a 72 years old visually impaired female who is a resident of Funja Village, Gram Panchayat Funja Tehsil Rampur District Shimla H.P. She is a housewife and blind by birth. She lives alone with her husband. The only source of income is old age pension, which is Rs. 1500 per month given by Himachal Pradesh Government. 5 years ago, Smt. Satya Devi turned up with complaint of dizziness and headache. Her husband accompanied her to MMU and after thorough examination she was diagnosed with Hypertension.



The nearest hospital from her home is 30 km away. There is no proper public transport in that area. She is solely dependent on the service of HelpAge India. The regular checkups during home visits by medical consultant have proven to be the boon for her. When asked for review she was only pouring her blessings to the HelpAge team for their efforts.

“She is also very happy with the service provided by the Mobile Health Care Unit.

Her blood pressure is under control now. She is very happy with MMU team and medicines as she is getting relief from the medicines provided by MMU. According to Sh. Satya Devi, such health services are boon for her and she wishes that it should keep running in future also so that more people are benefitted.”

2. Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa-Mobile Medical Unit Nathpa Jhakri-2



Kali Ram is a 85-year-old and lives in Badhal village district Shimla and he is suffering of asthma since long but due to low-income he was unable to get medical treatment.

Kali Ram lives with his wife and sustains only on government old age pension. Lacking economic assets of any significant scale he could not afford regular medical check-ups, let alone the costly medication prescribed by doctors.

Kali Ram's condition deteriorated significantly in recent months, and he was struggling to breathe properly. He had no choice but to seek medical assistance, but as he had no money to pay for the medical expenses, he felt helpless and thought he had no other option but to endure the pain and suffer silently.

Fortunately, the local SJVN Foundation through HELPAGE INDIA rose to the occasion and assisted him to get treatment from MMU. HelpAge India conducted a





thorough medical examination and prescribed him with the necessary medication to treat his asthma.

The medical staff also educated Kali Ram on proper asthma management, including lifestyle changes and breathing exercises that could help him manage his condition effectively. It was ensured that Kali Ram had access to regular medical check-ups and receives continuous supply of free medication, which helped control his asthma symptoms and improved his overall health. Kali Ram reviewed the services of MMU as:

“I am writing this message to express my heartfelt gratitude for the incredible work that you do in providing free health services to those in need. Your dedication to helping others and improving the lives of people in our community is truly remarkable, and I feel blessed to have received your assistance.

Thanks to your selfless efforts, I have been able to access healthcare services that I would not have been able to afford otherwise. The free medical check-ups, consultations, and treatments provided by your organization have been instrumental in ensuring that I am healthy and able to carry on with my daily life.”

3. Farming Training in CSK Palampur



Ms. Veena Kumari is a small-scale farmer who supports her family and meet her expenses through agricultural income. She is interested in traditional farming

practices and lacks a formal education. To support her family, she laboured arduously in the fields. Despite her best efforts, her farmland did not produce as much as she had anticipated. She received training in integrated agriculture the previous year, when she learned about current farming techniques and the best sowing practices. Training enabled her to discover the most effective natural and synthetic fertilisers. Additionally, she had practised farming in her fields this year, resulting in an increase in crop yield.

Her response is optimistic. She is appreciative of the SJVN CSR programme for providing her with the chance to learn about new technology and increase her crop yield. According to her, this training has empowered her, as she is now capable to farming on her own with the assistance of the offered knowledge, rather than asking others about every other problem she encounters in her fields.

4. Skill Development Training– Hamirpur



Ashwini Kumar, hailing from Hamirpur, is 28 years of age and has dropped out of his graduation in Humanities. Financial instability in his family

had forced him to drop out of college. He remained unemployed for a long time and had no means or skills to support his family.

In the years 2019–20, he received two months of training in mobile repair through SJVN. The training had been successful for him, and after completing the training, he





immediately joined a mobile repair shop. Through his job, he is financially supporting his family and is very satisfied with the training and is thankful to SJVN for providing him with this opportunity.

5. Assistance for the benefit of War Veterans and their dependents- Tailoring and Beautician Training in Palampur



Bandana Kumari, a Palampur resident, is 33 years old. She is married & has two children. Her father was a former army officer. During her conversation with our

investigator, she stated that she has for a long time felt vulnerable in her life and that she always desired financial independence.

In the years 2019–20, she received skill training in tailoring and beautician courses for two months. For a few months after receiving the training, she worked in parlor near her home. And for the last 1.5 years, she had been practicing her tailoring and beautician skills at home only. She mentioned that she had regular customers coming in for her parlor services, and she is now financially independent, which was her dream. She feels thankful as she is empowered due to this initiative and wishes to help others as well in future SJVN initiatives.

6. SJVN Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship Scheme



Yamini Sharma is 21 years old and from Hamipur, Himachal Pradesh. She completed her 12th in 2019. She wished to pursue engineering but being

from a lower-middle class family, her dream seemed farfetched. She was a meritorious student and wanted to change her financial situation by working hard.

In 2019, she passed her 12th with 96% marks and was awarded with SJVN Silver Jubilee Scholarship. The scholarship helped her not only in pursuing her dream career but also provided aid of Rs.24,000 per year till she completed her B.Tech course. She is currently in her third year of B. Tech at NIT Hamirpur and is very thankful to SJVN for the financial help.

7. Aspirational District Chamba- Mobile Van with CBNAAT Machine



The District of Chamba has seen an increase in TB cases for quite some time. People who visit the nearby hospitals after symptoms are diagnosed at an early stage. The

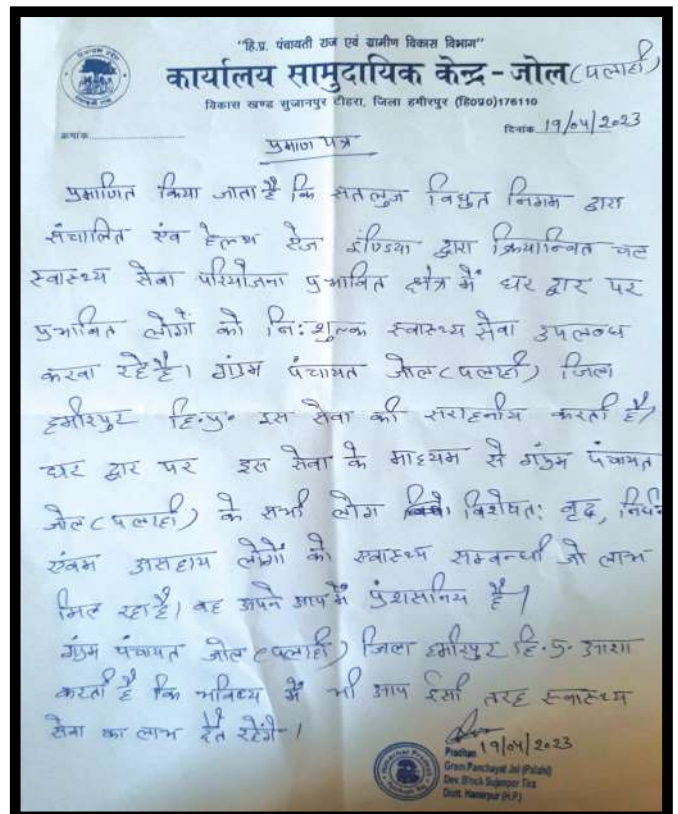
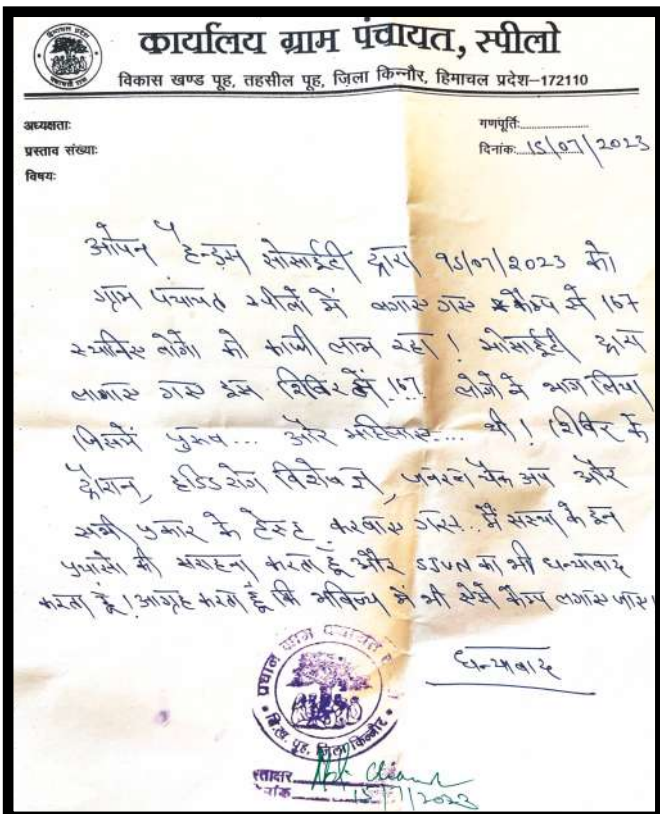
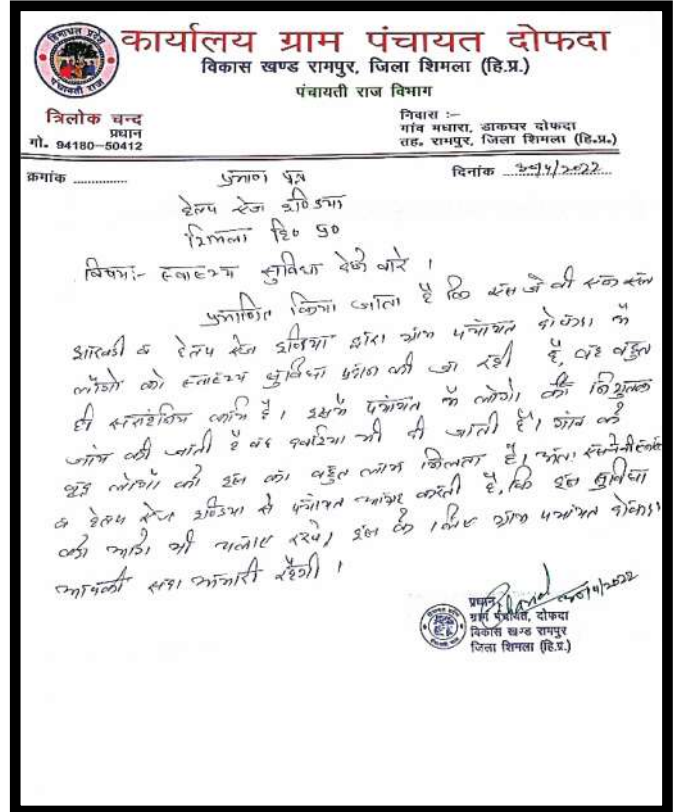
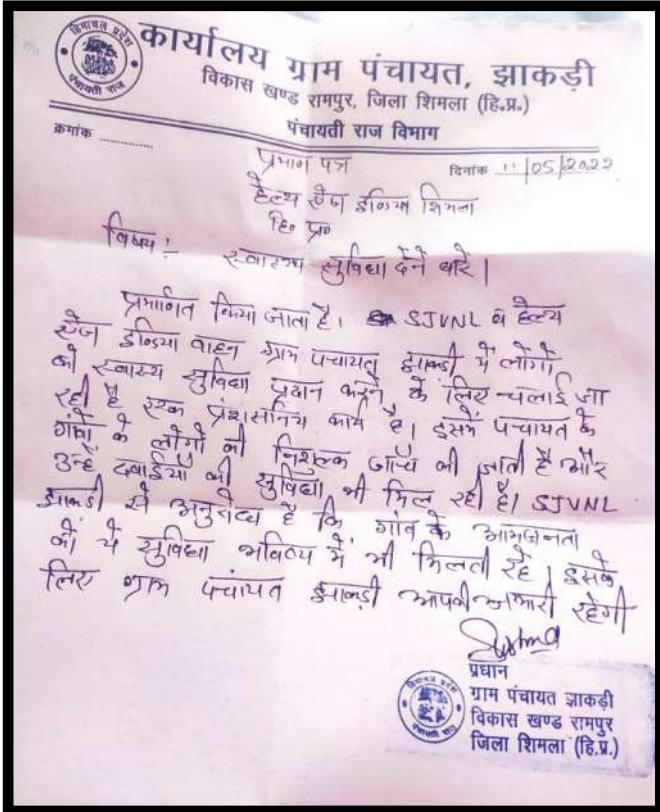
biggest problem persisting in the district was the inaccessibility of the hospital, which led to the spread of diseases at a higher rate. SJVN made provision for a mobile van with a CBNAAT machine for the area. In addition, SJVN is providing financial support of Rs. 60 Lakhs for 2 years for operating the CBNAAT Machine. The mobile van had been in use for the past months and had tested 2361 people till FY 2022-23.

The mobile van is attended by a technician and the results are made available after 2 hours of testing. The government officials reported that they are delighted with this SJVN initiative and that it has helped them contain the spread of TB in the area.

Closing Remarks

For the financial year 2022-23, the initial CSR budget of Rs.53.23 Cr increased upto Rs.59.84 Cr. for additional requirement which has been spent fully on various activities. The total budget spent in the year has surpassed the statutory budget of Rs. 36.46 Cr. by about 64%.

In health and hygiene, the flagship project mobile medical unit i.e. ‘Satluj Sanjeevani Sewa’ was able to reach out to 1,57,739 patients spread across its project areas in states of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Bihar and Maharashtra and Gujrat through 13 MMUs. In addition, funds of Rs.12.00 Cr. were provided to PM Cares fund to strengthen the fight against COVID-19. Various ayurvedic, specialized as well as multi specialized health camps were organized to provide a range of healthcare to the needy people around project areas in H.P, Uttarakhand and Maharashtra. Apart from above, dental clinic services, physiotherapy services and X-Ray services etc. are being extended for the communities around project areas through project hospitals. SJVN is also providing food baskets to 30 TB patients under program Ni-Kshay Mitra.

The SJVN has been promoting the cleanliness since long and under Swachh Bharat Mission, as per the directions of MoP, GoI SJVN observed Swachhta Pakhwada from 16th to 31st May 2022 and implemented the Swachhta Action Plan of Rs. 11.82 Cr. For the outstanding work in creating awareness about Swachhta, SJVN was conferred with First Prize in Swachhta

Pakhwada Awards 2022 by MoP, GoI

In FY 2022-23, 31 students from project affected areas were sponsored for various courses in Government ITIs in H.P. Further, a total of 526 local youths have been trained in various employable trades through renowned institutions such as CIDC, HIMCON, RCED and Tagore foundation. SJVN, for imparting skill training to farmers in area of new scientific methods of cultivation, entered into MOU with Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Floriculture, Nauni and CSK University Palampur. Around 8476 farmers have already been trained in last four years and have seen substantial improvement in their income. Further, 100 students from H.P, UK and Bihar were provided with the SJVN Silver Jubilee Merit Scholarship. So far, 1894 meritorious students have been benefited from this scheme. In addition, 159 students have been rewarded under SJVN merit reward scheme for students and sports persons of Kinnaur and Spiti. Also, 258 topper students of class 8th, 10th and 12th have been rewarded with one time reward under reward scheme for topper students of project affected area. SJVN foundation has also provided various basic & need based infrastructure facilities to the schools.

Under sustainable development, SJVN has been taking up various activities like repairing of bawaris, renovation of pond at Theog, installation of solar lights, Bio-diversity Park adjacent to CHQ, Shanan Shimla, Lift irrigation Scheme to village





Nirath, lift water supply scheme for village Nither, Dehra and Annas, awareness on Energy Conservation through painting competition etc. In addition, SJVN is also supporting Gau Sadans in and around the project area.

Under SJVN Silver Jubilee Women and Child Development Scheme support to BPL women during ante natal and post-natal period provided to enable them with healthy nourishment to the new born. Besides, skill development program through Udaan Sanstha for special children, skill development program to the people of slum area by AAROHAN, construction of school cum home for specially abled children in Dhalli, old age home for mental health of elderly people at Palampur are some of the initiatives that are helping in empowering the weaker section of the society.

Over the years SJVN has built and shaped thousands of local infrastructures. These include school buildings, roads, public parks, crematoriums, ambulance road, pucca paths, pavilions, bathing ghats, installation of benches, community halls, mahila mandal bhawans etc. To promote and preserve the local culture, the company has been supporting and renovating temple of local importance. Apart from these, Sri Badrinath Dham and Kedarnath Dham are also being developed as Smart Spiritual Towns.

This year, under assistance during natural disaster, the company provided financial support to Barusahib, Sirmour (HP) for restoration of infrastructure damage caused due to sudden cloud burst and provided

tarpaulin to the victims of landslide in Paingadh, Uttarakhand as a measure of instant relief.

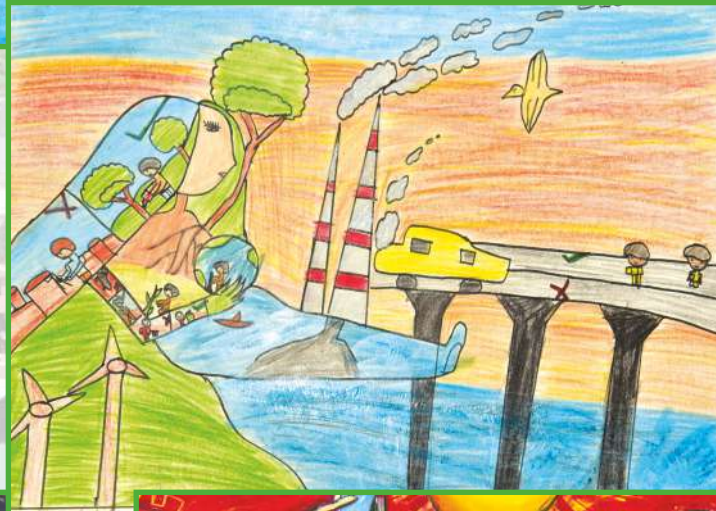
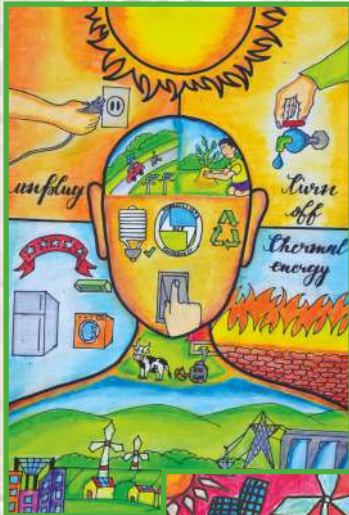

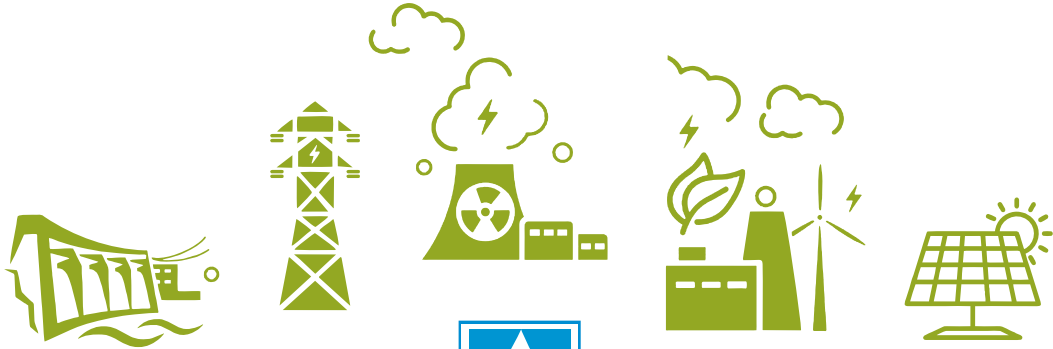
